From the desk of Cassandra Agredo

Hi! I'm Cassandra Agredo, the Executive Director of Xavier Mission. For those who are new to our community, Xavier Mission is the for-impact organization here at St. Francis Xavier. We say "for-impact" instead of "non-profit" because we prefer to be defined by what we DO rather than what we DON'T do. Xavier Mission has been impacting our city for the past 36 years. What began as a small group of parishioners handing out lunch bags quickly grew into a soup kitchen, food pantry, clothing room, and men's shelter. We also have programs that provide opportunities for self-sufficiency: the Life-Skills Empowerment Programs offer life-skills workshops, mentoring, and supportive services to homeless individuals and veterans; and the Financial Assistance Program assists families to pay back rent in order to prevent eviction, avoid homelessness, and maintain stability. Last year we served more than 1,200 meals at our Welcome Table and Food Pantry. We provided clothing to more than 1,200 individuals and beds to 3,500 men. Twenty-four people graduated from our LSEP Programs and we prevented the evictions of 72 families.

Every day we encounter people at the worst times of their lives. They come to us full of fear, worry, stress, and hopelessness. It can be overwhelming. It can be discouraging. But our guests don't give up, so neither do we. We answer the phone and we open the door. We listen, and we learn, and we love, no matter how hard it is, because that is what we are called to do every day. And we could not do this work without you – our supporters, volunteers, and champions!

Our Holiday Hope & Healing Campaign will begin soon. I invite all of you to join us in providing hope to the thousands of people who visit Xavier Mission. As you prepare for your holiday celebrations, we invite you to pull up a chair for one of our families too, and give the gift of a hot meal, a winter coat, a warm bed, a new path in life, or the stability of home.

Archbishop Romero said "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well." We at Xavier Mission know we can't do everything, but together – with your help – we can do something, and we can do it well.

Pope Francis has asked us to pray for the success of the "Synod on the Amazon" which will be held in Rome Oct. 6 - 27, 2019. Its theme is "Amazonia: New Pathways for the Church and for an Integral Ecology" and will focus on these topics:

ENVIRONMENT & BIODIVERSITY: The Amazon basin encompasses more than 35% of the South American continent within nine countries, 30–50%

of the world's flora and fauna, 20% of the world's fresh water and 1/3 of our planet's primary forests. But according to the UN, "an estimated one million species are under threat of extinction. Climate change and increased human intervention are driving the Amazon to a 'point of no return' with high rates of deforestation, forced displacement of the population, and pollution." The rainforest is considered a huge carbon sink for the world. Many defenders of the environment and rainforest have been killed.

INDIGENOUS POPULATIONS: Within the Pan-Amazonian region, there are about three million indigenous people, representing about 390 different peoples and nationalities...Currently, between 70% and 80% of the Pan-Amazonian population resides in urban areas. Indigenous populations are exploited as they become victims of the changing values of the global economy, for which profit has higher value than human dignity. Pope Francis: Indigenous peoples have much to teach us...In their love for their land and their relationship with the ecosystem, they know the Creator God, the source of life.

AGRIBUSINESS/MINING/DEFORESTATION: The wealth of the Amazonian rainforest and rivers is being threatened by expansive economic interests i.e. indiscriminate logging in the rainforest for wood, export crops, and mining. Agro-toxins and oil spills also contaminate rivers, lakes, and tributaries.

SACRAMENTAL MINISTRY: There must be deep listening at this Synod, especially between the faithful and the Church authorities. One of the main points to be heard is "the cry of thousands of communities deprived of the Sunday Eucharist for long periods of time.

THE ROLE OF WOMEN: The exploitation of Amazonian peoples is evident in the dramatic increase in trafficking, especially of women, for the purpose of sexual and commercial exploitation. They thus lose their leadership roles in their communities' transformation. One aim of the Synod will be to identify local pastoral experiences that can enlighten discernment for new guidelines.

Let us pray that those gathered in the Synod have the wisdom and courage to address these critical issues by taking a true ecological approach so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.
