

Comunidades Hispanas Ignacianas "En Todo Amar y Servir"

¿Qué son las Comunidades Hispanas Ignacianas?

Las Comunidades Hispanas Ignacianas son grupos pequeños y estables de adultos que se reúnen una vez al mes para:

- 1. Profundizar su Fe
- 2. Acompañarse en su Camino Espiritual Ignaciano
- 3. Poner su Fe en Acción

Las comunidades estarán compuestas de 12 a 15 adultos comprometidos a profundizar su fe estudiando y practicando la espiritualidad ignaciana. Nuestras reuniones serán dirigidas por personas capacitadas para facilitar estas reuniones en español. Nos reuniremos el tercer sábado de cada mes para reflexionar sobre temas como la oración ignaciana, los jesuitas, la forma de proceder, etc. Los participantes recibirán materiales adicionales para la oración y el estudio entre reuniones.

Hispanic Ignatian Communities "To Serve and Love in All Things"

What are Hispanic Ignatian Communities?

Hispanic Ignatian Communities are small, stable groups of adults who meet once a month for:

- 1. Deepen Your Faith
- 2. Accompany yourself on your Ignatian Spiritual Path
- 3. Putting Your Faith into Action

The communities will be composed of 12 to 15 adults committed to deepening their faith by studying and practicing Ignatian spirituality. Our meetings will be led by people trained to facilitate these meetings in Spanish. We will meet on the third Saturday of the month to reflect on topics such as Ignatian prayer, the Jesuits, the way of proceeding, etc. Participants will receive additional materials for prayer and study between meetings.

The mission of the communities is summed up in the motto "to love and to serve in all things", taken from the Spiritual Exercises of Loyola. The ultimate goal is to help participants discern how they are called to put their faith into action - how they can love more fully and where God is calling them to serve.
