

## Stewardship News

Thank you to all of you who have given so much of your time, talent, and treasure to support our parish throughout the year. We are pleased to present the preliminary financial results for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2019. The Statement of Activities summarizes revenues and expenditures for last year compared to budget and the budget for the new fiscal year that started September 1<sup>st</sup>. Our final financial results will be included in our 2019 Annual Report that is planned for distribution on the first Sunday of Advent, December 1st. We finished the year with an operating surplus of \$423,542 that does not include the \$37,981 in capital expenditures. The favorable results versus budget were due primarily to a generous \$460,000 bequest and increased income from weddings, baptisms, and Easter collection. For the first time in nine years, our Sunday collection declined. Last year our Sunday collection fell approximately \$50,000 – a drop of nearly 6%.

Last year we successfully negotiated a 20-year extension on the lease of our former elementary school on 17th Street with Winston Preparatory School which provided for a substantial increase in rent from the previous lease. Our rental property continues to be a vital asset to the financial health of the parish. Next fiscal year's rental income of \$1.3 million is the largest source of income in the budget, which represents 49% of our total income. Although we are budgeting a \$159,771 operating surplus, we also are planning \$1.3 million in capital repairs and improvements for the 17th Street property and our church over the next four years. Our rental income will be the primary source to fund the capital projects. We need your increased support in the coming year through your Sunday offertory, maintenance 2nd collection, and Christmas and Easter gifts to help ensure we cover our expenses.


