From the Pastor's Desk

November is a month when we are invited to consider many of the blessings in our lives. Liturgically, we begin by celebrating the Feast of All Saints and then remember All Souls. In our Catholic tradition we are connected with the living and the dead, with the heroes and heroines who have touched our lives and inspired us. So much of who we are today comes as a gift from the example and teaching of parents, grandparents, teachers, coaches, friends who have enriched our lives. And, of course, we end the month of November with Thanksgiving Day, a national feast day of remembrance and gratitude. For the original pilgrims and for us, it is a day to thank God for all of the blessings received throughout the year. We can begin reflecting on our personal list of people, places and things to be grateful for now and throughout the month.

In the Jesuit world, we have additional days of prayer for all of the saints and blessed of the Society of Jesus as well as a day of remembrance for all departed Jesuits. November is also filled with seven additional feast days for Jesuit saints, some martyrs, some dedicated pastors and teachers, all inspirations for us.

In that context, the first week of November is a week of **PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS TO THE SOCIETY OF JESUS**. I invite us all to pray for vocations and encourage likely young men to consider whether they have a vocation to be a Jesuit priest of brother.

This year the Xavier Jesuit Community has among its members a deacon, Rev. Ricardo Da Silva, S.J. Ricardo is from South Africa and is completing a degree in journalism at Columbia University. He will be ordained a priest back home this summer. In order to better help him prepare for his future ministry, I have invited him to be part of our worshiping community in a more official role. We, as a community, can help to form him for service in the Church. I'm sure you will find him a welcome addition and that your support and prayers will help him grow as a minister of the Gospel. Ricardo will start helping at some masses and baptisms in the coming month.

We are excited to announce a collaboration with The Center for Anti-Violence Education (www.caeny. org) and will be sponsoring an UpStander Training and Basic Self-Defense. "Upstander workshops are designed to equip those facing hate and violence with de-escalation skills and basic self-defense techniques. Additionally, this training empowers bystanders with the tools they need to help those facing harassment by choosing intentionally from a continuum of tactics. These two approaches combined offer New Yorkers unique and critical options for keeping our communities as safe as possible and mitigating violence."

Our training workshop will focus more on Upstander and de-escalation skills.

Día de Muertos (Day of the Dead)

Día de Muertos, or Day of the Dead, is a Mexican holiday that honors and reveres deceased family, friends, and ancestors. The cultural celebration can be traced back to the time of the Aztecs, 3,000 years back. It is not the Mexican version of Halloween. Though the theme is death, it is about remembrance, respect, and life-affirming joy for our beloved dead. This tradition is rooted in the native Mexican belief that life on earth is a preparation for the next world and of the importance of maintaining a strong relationship with the dead. It is a time for families to gather and welcome the souls of the dead on their annual visit home. The holiday is celebrated throughout Mexico and over the years has become popular in some regions of the U.S.A, and other parts of the world. The multi-day traditional celebration officially begins on Oct. 31 (All Hallows' Day), followed by Nov. 1st (All Saints' Day), and ends on Nov. 2nd (All Souls' Day).

In observance of this significant culturally-rich holiday, our Día de Muertos altar was created in the Joseph transept. The traditional custom is to build altars called "ofrendas" (offerings), honoring the memory of our beloved who have passed. The altars are typically adorned with Marigold flowers (Cempasúchil), Calaveras (skulls), catrinas (richly dressed skeletons), incense (copal), candles, papel picado (intricate tissue paper banners), sugar skulls, pan de Muertos (bread of the dead), photographs, and other mementos to honor those who have passed, including their favorite food and drink. It is a means of always keeping the departed alive in our hearts by celebrating their lives lived.

Marking our first anniversary of the holiday here at Xavier, this year, we are dedicating the altar in the memory of the seven children who have died under the care/custody of the various U.S. immigration agencies over the last year alone. Their names are Mariee Juarez, 1-year-old; Darylin Valle, 10-year-old; Jakelin Caal Maquin, 7-year-old; Felipe Gomez Alonzo, 8-year-old; Juan de León Gutiérrez, 16-year-old; Wilmer Josué Ramirez Vasquez, 2.5-year-old; and Carlos Gregorio Hernandez Vasquez, 16-year-old. May we honor their memories and hold them and their respective families in our prayers and consciousness.

Join in this special traditional celebration of remembering those who have died by bringing in a photo of your lost ones, pets included. Please place the pictures in the basket by the altar, or leave with the parish office front desk. These will be incorporated in this year's altar. The altar will remain on display for November.

Día de Muertos or Día de los Muertos:

The frequent use of Día de **los** Muertos in the U.S. is a back-translation of Day of the Dead into Spanish. In Mexico, traditionally, this holiday is known as **Día de Muertos** (dropping the article "los" from the festival name).




