From the Pastor's Desk

We live in an era when there are many voices shouting for our attention. This week the public sessions of the impeachment inquiry started with both sides claiming to represent the true values of our country. There are divided governments and protests throughout the world.

For three weeks in October, the Synod of the Amazon took place in Rome in relative obscurity and quiet. The whole premise of this synod and any synod is to prayerfully and thoughtfully discuss issues of importance about which people feel deeply and passionately in a respectful and civil process which prizes listening even above speaking. Taking place in a context of faith, these synods invoke the Holy Spirit as a partner in their dialog.

The headlines focus on the two recommendations to change the discipline and practice of the Western Church by ordaining married deacons as priests and ordaining women as deacons. They are certainly worth discussing and Pope Francis has taken the recommendations seriously. These recommendations come out of a process which focused on the needs of the indigenous peoples of the Amazon region. In two years of preparation, about 300 listening sessions engaged over 80,000 people to hear their story. The land and the air are being destroyed and whole tribes are facing extinction because of exploitive land use policies. Many of the local governments are either helpless or complicit in the exploitation and so the people turn to the Church to hear their needs and advocate for them.

Their spiritual needs require an incorporation of indigenous culture, music and art into prayer forms and raising up local leaders to guide and direct them, hence the call for expanded ordained leaders.

The original documents were issued in Spanish and will soon be translated and made more widely available. The Vatican has promised to respond to the recommendations in a timely fashion. Meanwhile, the synodal process is being presented as a paradigm for decision making, not only on the level of the bishops and the Pope but even on the parish level. It's not our natural instinct as a way of proceeding. As Americans we tend to look to efficient, problem-solving approaches or political posturing and vote counting as the only ways to address issues of importance. The synodal approach is more gradual and requires patient, open-minded listening to the heart. In the end, it leads to a more grace-filled solution. We will be trying this approach on some issues soon.

On a different topic:

Next Sunday, November 24, the second collection will be for Catholic Charities Campaign For Charity and Justice. Formerly called the Catholic charities Campaign, this fund not only supports the tremendous work of Catholic Charities throughout our area, but also includes grants to parish-based outreach for the poor. The Xavier Mission has received grants from this campaign in the last two years. Today is the WORLD DAY FOR THE POOR so it appropriate that we plan to support the work of Catholic Charities New York in their extraordinary service to the poor.


