Dear Fellow Members of the St. Francis Xavier Community:

This year, among the things we will do as a community, the Church of St. Francis Xavier will reflect together about the process by which members of our Pastoral Council discern and are selected to serve on the Council. The current process was adopted about 10 years ago after careful parish-wide reflection. Some parishioners have recommended that the parish community look at the discernment process and consider together how well the procedure is working and how it might be improved going forward. Good governance principles support this kind of reflection.

Over the next year, the Pastoral Council will reach out to the broad Xavier community, offering a variety of opportunities to consider how the discernment process might be refined and improved. Among those we hope to engage in this reflection are the Xavier ministries, our parish staff, liturgical ministers, parishioners who participate in our liturgies, and former members of the Pastoral Council. This year's Ministries Retreat, scheduled for February 2, 2020, also will include this topic. With this letter, as explained below, we solicit personal responses to questions about the process and any other thoughts you might have about it.

**Background.** As Xavier's *Guidelines for Leadership* explain, the Council is the primary leadership body of our parish, gathering monthly in meetings with the Pastor. Acting as servant leaders and stewards of the entire parish, the Council is empowered to provide pastoral planning for the parish community by setting goals and objectives, assisting parishioners as they implement pastoral plans, and evaluating Xavier's activities in light of fulfillment of the parish's overall mission. The Council consists of ten parishioners, each selected to serve a three-year term. At the conclusion of this term, Council members may choose to serve for a second consecutive three-year term. You may find more information about the Council—including its current membership, *Guidelines for Leadership* and recorded minutes of recent meetings—on the website, <a href="https://www.sfxavier.org">www.sfxavier.org</a>.

When an opening on the Council arises, all registered parishioners are invited to participate as selectors and/or discerners in the new member discernment process. The selection process takes place over two meetings held in early June on weeknight evenings. At the first meeting, Council members explain the commitment expected of those who serve on the Council and describe the Council's responsibilities and decision-making principles. Persons who feel called to serve on the Council introduce themselves, though people who have not yet decided to discern may choose to introduce themselves at the second meeting. Five questions are distributed that ask the candidates to reflect on Xavier and the gifts they believe they can contribute to the Council's work. The candidates reflect on these questions over the following week and prepare brief responses to them.

The following week, the group again gathers. The candidates who are discerning to serve on the Council share their responses to the questions with the group. The deeply personal and often moving testimony provided by discerners in response to the questions is a moment of grace for everyone in the room. After hearing these responses, the group prayerfully reflects and talks with one another. Then registered parishioners who have attended both meetings indicate privately on a slip of paper who they believe to be best suited to serve on the Council at this time. A two-thirds majority is necessary for selection to the Council. If no person achieves two-thirds level of approval, the names of the three discerners supported by the greatest number and their level of support are announced to the meeting. This process is repeated until a discerner receives the support of one-half of those assembled. If there is more than one opening on the Council, the entire procedure is then repeated until all openings are filled.

Unlike selection processes for secular leadership bodies, the discernment process for Xavier's Pastoral Council is intended to summon the Holy Spirit in our midst. We prayerfully gather together to determine as a community whose gifts are best suited to serve the parish at this time, in this way. In practice, the process has led many to feel called to serve even when they did not initially expect to discern. And, the movement of the Spirit that unfolds has led to selection of Council members known by a broad cross-section of the parish community.

**Reflection.** As a first step in reflection on the selection process, we invite all members of the community to let us know your thoughts about it. We offer the following questions about the process to assist your consideration:

- How can Xavier achieve our dual aspirations to select Pastoral Council members in a communal, prayerful fashion while encouraging as many parishioners as possible to participate in the selection process?
- How can the process continue to encourage personal, Spirit-filled testimony from those discerning for the Council while taking tender care of the vulnerability this requires?
- How can the selection process yield a Pastoral Council that reflects Xavier's vibrant community in all of its diversities, which are a true gift from God?
- Are there ways that the process can be more open, transparent, and accessible to all? Are there ways that the process can be more prayerful and holy? And how do we put all these hopes for the process in right balance?

Please forward your thoughts to us via email (pastoralcouncil@sfxavier.org.) Of course, each of us is always available to talk about this reflection and any other topic with you in person. Also, please know that as we move forward, we expect to provide updates about the steps taken and insights people offer. Together with the parish community, we look forward to the year ahead!
