From the Pastor's Desk

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice."

These uplifting words from the Entrance Antiphon of the Third Sunday of Advent don't always reflect our mood at this point of our Christmas preparations. In fact, I am reminded of an avuncular Jesuit from my seminary days who barked out the verse so that it formed a threatening command rather than a joy-filled exhortation.

Rejoice! The reminder three quarters of the way to Christmas is a cause to reflect on what I am grateful for in my life: the people, events, circumstances of my life which gift me with hope and joy. Do I appreciate them? Reverence them even? We all take things and especially people for granted. Now and again we should stop the whirlwind which is our life and pause to catch a breath and give thanks. We should be at peace with the people in our lives, the space in our lives and, most importantly, with God in our lives.

The Honduras Companion Communities Project will again offer a selection of holiday cards for sale after all the masses during the weekends of December 15 and 22 The cards provide a way for you to remember friends and loved ones while contributing to the local community projects in Honduras which Xavier parishioners have supported for the last 20 years. This is our major fund raising event for maintaining our scholarship programs managed by local community groups in Honduras. This has been another turbulent year in Honduras, with months of protests and popular demonstrations against the corrupt government which have often disrupted the school year and have resulted in many injuries and some deaths.

Again this year, our cards consist of artwork created by children who have lived in Casa Corazon, a home in Honduras operated by the Sisters of Mercy for orphaned children who are HIV+. Aside from printing expenses, all proceeds from the sale go to continuing the scholarships we have been providing for secondary school students in the hope that education will lead to satisfactory employment opportunities which will allow these students to remain in their country and work to bring about positive change.
