

### From the Pastor's Desk

I was recently asked if the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which we celebrate today was the end of the Christmas Season or the beginning of Ordinary Time to which I replied, "Yes." The celebration of Jesus' baptism in the Jordan is indeed a hinge feast, transitioning us from the celebration of the birth of the Messiah to Jesus' adult active ministry announcing the good news to the people of his time and place.

For most of us the decorations are down and put away and the tree has been put on the sidewalk to be mulched. We are settling in to a new year and decade which promise to be anything but ordinary.

As a people of faith, hope and love we turn first to prayer, as Jesus did immediately after the baptism in the Jordan. Our prayer should be for our leaders. For political leaders to try to heal the wounds of divisiveness which plague us. For Church leaders to bring transparency and healing to the wounds caused by the abuse of vulnerable people. For world leaders to work for healing of our Mother Earth. We pray also for the many people around the world who suffer from unjust conditions.

After prayer, with hope and love, we turn to action. No one of us can heal all of the wounds around us or achieve perfect justice and peace, but each can do something. We can become informed citizens as our electoral process moves forward. We can become more actively involved in issues which speak to our hearts. We can resolve to be more kind and forgiving in our daily life. Such acts touch lives and bring healing.

One hundred years ago, in the aftermath of the "War to end all wars," there was an optimism which spawned a decade we called the "Roaring Twenties." Let us work to make this decade a decade when hope was restored and healing begun.


