## From the Pastor's Desk

This Seventh Sunday of Ordinary Time is our last "ordinary" Sunday until late June. Appropriately, it prepares us for Lent with an exhortation to holiness. The ordinary holiness we are called to is to live in the light of God's love and grace in our lives. It's a life of gratitude, of sharing God's abundant love with others. The challenge for us, in our hectic ordinary lives, is to be aware of the love and the grace.

That's where Lent can help us. The season of prayer, penance and good works asks us to be more mindful for forty days as we prepare for the Sacred Triduum. Many have regular observances for the season-foods to give up, prayers to say, acts of generosity to engage in. If they are helpful, please continue to do them.

Here at Xavier, we have a variety of programs to choose from. The Environment Ministry has prepared a "Care for Creation 2020 Lenten Calendar" to encourage awareness and environment-friendly activities. The Xavier Players will present "No Greater Love" this Saturday. We have started the podcast/discussion series Deliver Us, in conjunction with America Media to process the abuse crisis in the Church. Various ministries have come together to sponsor Stations of the Cross with different perspectives and emphasizes on Fridays in Lent. We will have a Lenten Camino on five Sundays in Lent from 1:30 to 3:30p. Each will present a contemporary faith leader and offer opportunity for discussion and material for prayer during the week. Bill Cain, S.J. has put together The Diary of Jesus Christ based on a series of talks he gave to the 7:45 mass group a few years ago. That will be on March 22 at 6:30. All of these programs are listed in the bulletin. The offerings are broad. We hope you will find something to engage you in your own Lenten journey.
