THE PURIFICATION AND ENLIGHTENMENT STAGE STARTS TODAY

From the desk of Luz Marina Díaz

The Purification and Enlightenment Period is the third stage of the RCIA process. It coincides with Lent and is an intense preparation marked by prayer and study by the elect (unbaptized) and candidates (Catholic and non-Catholic Baptized) with the help of their sponsors and the RCIA team, and prayers by the parish community. This period begins with The Rite of Election and The Call to Continuing Conversion.

On March 1, at the 11:30 am Mass, the catechumens and their sponsors stand in the sanctuary to receive the community's blessing with the Rite of Sending before heading to St. Patrick's Cathedral for the celebration of the Rite of Election officiated by Cardinal Timothy Dolan. The Rite of Election celebrates God's call for men and women to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist during the Easter Vigil. The catechumens who, from now on, are called the Elect, write their names in the Book of The Elect.

The Call to Continuing Conversion is for non-Catholic Baptized preparing to be received into full communion in the Catholic Church or for Catholics completing their initiation through Confirmation and First Eucharist during the Easter Vigil. It will take place at 11:30 am Mass on Sunday, March 8th. The Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion marks a time of more intense preparation for the sacraments of initiation, and a more profound commitment by the candidates. The elect and the candidates will be encouraged to follow Christ with great generosity, openness, and inner freedom.

THE Xavier community supports catechumens and candidates in different ways. The RCIA team is formed by parishioners prepared to teach about spirituality, liturgy, Bible, prayer, sacraments, Church history, and doctrines using the teachings of great contemporary theologians. The sponsors are parishioners chosen by the catechumens and candidates to accompany them spiritually on the RCIA journey.

The entire Xavier community accompanies the RCIA participants through prayer and their presence at the most significant acts of the Christian initiation process such as the Rite of Acceptance and Welcome we celebrated in November 2019, the Rite of Anointing of the Catechumens that took place in February, Rite of Sending, Call to Continuing Conversion, the scrutinies that we will celebrate during Lent and the reception of the sacraments on the Easter Vigil. The catechumens and candidates can experience in a tangible way that the community accompanies them in this journey. The community becomes the visible place of faith and a point of orientation for being integrated into the body of Christ.

The community is the prime minister of the RCIA. If you are attending the 11:30 am Mass, I invite you to stop by and talk to our catechumens and candidates who sit with the sponsors and RCIA team in reserved pews in front of the sanctuary on the ambo side. A personal greeting would make the community presence in an even more tangible way.

For instance, cattle ranching accounts for approximately 80% of deforestation in Brazil.
