From the Pastor's Desk

We live in a time of high anxiety and never more so than these days with the corona virus dominating the headlines and mixed messages from the media.

The threat from the virus is real especially for vulnerable populations. People should act prudently and according to the advice of public health officials: wash your hands frequently, avoid touching your face, avoid crowded situations, don't shake hands, sneeze or cough into your elbow. If you are feeling unwell, especially with fever and a cough, you advised to stay home. There is NO obligation to attend mass on Sunday if you are ill.

The situation is ever evolving and changes from day to day so it is important to keep well informed.

Here at Xavier we have suspended the use of the cup for the duration of the threat. We have emptied the holy water font. We ask people to receive the eucharist in their hands rather than on the tongue and to refrain from holding or shaking hands at the kiss of peace or the Our Father.

At present, we intend to continue with the usual sacramental ministry subject to any directives from the Archdiocese or the City to the contrary. Beginning this Sunday, we will livestream the 11:30 mass each Sunday for those who are unable to attend. This will continue throughout Lent. Easter is already scheduled to be livestreamed. We will review the situation after Easter. For those without internet EWTN broadcasts Sunday masses on television.

Our readings for the third Sunday, remind us that God provides us with the graces and helps we need in different times of our life. With confidence in God and prudence in our self-care, we should get through this troubled time.

Let us continue to pray for one another.
