### From the Pastor's Desk

### IN DAYS OF UNCERTAINTY (CORONAVIRUS)

Loving God, we come to you full of anxiety about what may happen in the coming days and weeks. Shower us with the peace Jesus promised to his disciples, and make us into steady pillars for those around us. In this time of uncertainty and epidemic, wake us up to the reminder that we are not alone.

Even as we are asked to keep our distance from others, help us to find ways to reach out to those who need our support. We pray especially for those whose incomes and livelihoods are threatened. For the children who will miss meals due to school closures. For those already isolated, lonely and scared. Loving God, give them your peace, and through our hands ensure they have what they need.

Sustain, strengthen and protect all caregivers. Bless them as they offer compassionate care and show selfless courage in the face of risk.

Remind us, each time we wash our hands, that in our baptism you call us to let go of our fears and live in joy, peace, and hope. Amen.

Seeing is one of our five senses which we often take for granted. Our readings for this Sunday focus on seeing from a couple of different perspectives: The prophet Samuel looks on the seven sons of Jesse to find God's choice for a new king and is reminded not to look on and judge people from a merely human point of view but too see into the heart as God does. The Gospel of John recounts the cure of the man born blind. Jesus' act of compassion dispels the notion that the blind one or the parents are guilty of sin, as many believed. When given the gift of sight the formerly blind person can see the hand of God at work while the official religious authorities only see a violation of the Sabbath.

We're all "seeing" more than we ever imagined in terms of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The immediate health risk to each of us is real. We need to take all prudent precautions and follow the directives of public health officials. Stay safe. We are beginning to see the economic impact on small businesses and hourly and "gig" workers.

As we see the changes taking place on an hourly basis, we necessarily reevaluate the essentials of our daily lives. As a people of faith, we know that we are not alone in this crisis. Our loving and gracious Creator accompanies us each moment of the day. Likewise, we are united to one another in our parish community. A number of parishioners have signed up to the Pastoral Council's initiative to connect through a phone community.

**Beginning this week** we are offering a variety of opportunities to meet and connect through various media platforms. As of March 18, we will be celebrating a 12:05 private mass and posting it live on the Parish Facebook page. Members of the community will be offering faith sharing options and the rosary through ZOOM. ## 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Stewardship News

In these difficult and trying times we want to thank all of you who have given so much of your time, talent, and treasure to support Xavier throughout the year. Please know that even though public masses have been cancelled for the foreseeable future and we are not gathering together here on 16th Street in the church building, we are still the church, the people of God and can practice our faith by reading the scriptures for the day, praying, watching televised or streaming masses, and caring for our elderly neighbors. We still rely on your generous support in the Sunday collection to pay staff salaries, utilities, maintenance, office expenses, and the unbudgeted expense of live streaming masses. Our three e-giving options described below provide an environmentally friendly, convenient, no cost and secure way to support the parish even if you absent from Mass for any reason. It helps us bring consistency to our cash flow and reduces the time it takes our staff to count and report cash. We hope you will set aside a few minutes today to enroll in one of these options. If you don't use one of those options, we ask that you support the parish by mailing a check to the parish office.

#### **FAITH DIRECT**



Faith Direct allows you to support our Sunday Offertory, Easter, Christmas and any other collection on a recurring basis via automatic payment from your checking account or credit card. You can enroll online by clicking the Donate Now button on the upper-right hand corner of our parish homepage or mail in an enrollment form available in the back of the church or from the parish office. With online enrollment you will be able to access your account any time to view and

make changes to your account information and gifts. Last month 459 families used Faith Direct to support Xavier. 54% of our Sunday offertory comes from Faith Direct.

We finished the second quarter with a surplus of \$256,261 versus a budgeted surplus of \$280,309. The unfavorable results from budget are due to higher expenses offset partially by higher income. Higher income included weddings (\$29,000 above budget), the Sunday Offertory (\$27,000 above budget), and Donations and Bequests (\$14,000 above budget).
