From the Pastor's Desk

This Sunday we celebrate Mothers' Day in the context of the quarantine and sheltering in place. As with so many "ordinary" events of the last two months, our isolation adds a poignancy to our celebrations. The Gay Catholics group in the parish circulated a request through their email list for folks to share their favorite picture and memory of their mother. It has been quite touching.

In that context I was thinking of my own mother and resilience. The third of four daughters and seventh of ten children, Regina was just about to start junior year of high school when her mother contracted tuberculosis and was sent into isolation for a year. It was the mid-nineteen thirties and the great depression was in full force. Her older sisters had jobs necessary to support the family and so Mom had to take a leave of absence for the year to run the household. She never talked about it much. It was what you did in families in those days.

From my own observation, years later, the experience of that year created a special "glue" in the relationships of the siblings to one another and to her especially. An extra closeness developed which passed on to the next generation and the next as my mother's family continues to get together for an annual Christmas party, now in its sixty-eighth year. Around 110-120 of the cousins show up each year. Adversity, mixed with love and faith, became a source of unity. That is what constitutes resilience.

I think the year of organizing a large family contributed to a sense of equilibrium for nothing seemed too phase her after that. Oh, and by the way, when she resumed school she ran into a dashing ex-Bronxite now commuting to Fordham University from Queens. They dated, fell in love and the rest, as they say, is history.

Did you know that Cremation is an acceptable form of Christian burial?


Did you know that Cremated remains must be cared for reverently and properly interned in a sacred place?

Did you know that there is only one Catholic Cemetery in Manhattan? It is "The Basilica of Saint Patrick's "Old Cathedral at 263 Mulberry St New York N.Y. Over a century ago due to lack of space the practice of interring on Basilica grounds was suspended and limited to the interment of former Catholic Pastors. The Basilica revised the tradition with the introduction of a Columbarium. Due to the overwhelming demand for the niches in the first outdoor Columbarium, more will be added to the Basilica's historical cemetery, as well as adding many more in the indoor catacombs. Each Columbarium will be hand built by stone artisans and contain niches for the internment of cremated remains. They will fit impeccably into the historic design of the Basilica creating a solemn refuge for the faithful departed and a sanctuary for the bereaved. The urns will be reverently placed inside a secured niche and memorialized with a granite stone face plate on which the names will be meticulously engraved.

For over 200 years the Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral has been preparing Catholics for eternity. With the introduction of the Columbaria, they are preparing a sacred and historical place in which to spend it.

THE COST FOR SFX IS \$9,995 FOR THE NICHE WHICH WILL HOLD 2 URNS. THE PRICE IS NOW SUBSTANTIALLY HIGHER BUT WILL BE HONORED FOR OUR PARISHIONERS. WITH CORONA VIRUS TAKING SO MANY LIVES IN NYC AND MORE PEOPLE BEING CREMATED THE DEMAND FOR SPACE IS HIGH. IF YOU WANT TO SECURE YOUR NICHE WE NEED YOUR COMMITMENT.

CORONAVIRUS RESPONSE FUND

Because of restrictions on gatherings, and concerns about social distancing, we have had to close some of our programs and change how others operate.

Our WELCOME TABLE has switched from a sit-down meal to a grab-and-go lunch bag model (which is twice as costly as a sit-down meal). We are making and distributing 1,500 lunch bags each Sunday!

Our FOOD PANTRY has switched from a customer-choice model to a prepackaged bag model. We are also delivering groceries to our senior guests who cannot safely leave their homes.
