From the Pastor's Desk

This weekend marks the formal close of the Season of Creation celebration. We are very grateful to Nancy Lorence and the members of the Environment Ministry for their efforts to inform and engage us in reflection on the various threats to Mother Earth and invite us to take action to preserve and protect our planet. The formal end of the celebration isn't the end of our efforts and, I'm sure, we will be alerted to opportunities to take action at appropriate times.

Last weekend we celebrated Catechetical Sunday and welcomed the children from pre-k through third grade to Family Faith. As part of their blended learning program this year, each grade will be in-person once a month and remote for the other three weeks. No more than half the grades will be present at a time so we will have some children twice a month.

RCIA welcomed eleven candidates to the beginning of this year's program.

I hope most of you have received your voting instructions. I found the new "voter's tag" interesting. Hopefully it will expedite in person voting. Personally, I will explore the opportunity to vote early. Whether you choose to vote in person or by mail. PLEASE VOTE.

The Pastoral Council met for its annual retreat last weekend. Among the new initiatives this year: two members of the Council will be in touch with ministry leaders to discuss how we can support your efforts in this pandemic environment; we hope to offer a Prayer Service on a Civic Examen on **October 18**th. The Pastoral Council will also sponsor a Town Hall meeting both in person and through Zoom on **Monday, November 9**. The topic: Our Life Together. Stay tuned for further information.

Christian Life Communities (CLCs) are small faith groups who come together regularly in prayer, support and service rooted in the Ignatian tradition of mission and discernment. Xavier currently has one CLC group which is open to new members. An information session will be offered for all who might be interested in learning more.

Currently, the Global Catholic Climate Movement, GCCM, posts on its website an article, 10 saints whose care for creation still inspires us today. For some of the saints listed, it meant simply appreciating the beauty of God's creation about them (St. Therese of Lisieux). For others, it meant doing no harm to animals and being a vegetarian (St. Philip Neri). For others, it meant raising their voice in praise of God's creation and calling us to be co-creators (St. Hildegard) or raising their voice in alarm at the degradation of the world's environment and calling us to care (St. John Paul II). And for St. Francis of Assisi, the patron of ecology whose feast day we celebrate this Sunday, it meant showing us "how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society and inner peace" (LS 10). Pope Francis calls us to follow their examples.

We can add our names to the list, maybe not as saints, but as people of faith who care for creation in a saintly way. As we close this Season of Creation, let's take a look at the beauty around us. Think about what actions we can take personally to give more life to the environment or reduce harm to it. And consider how we might use our voice to protect our Common Home.

Here is a way to solidify that commitment. The Environment Ministry, as part of Metro NY Catholic Climate Movement, invites you to sign the Declaration of Commitment for this 5th Anniversary Year of Laudato Si. For this anniversary, Pope Francis is asking us to do more. Let's start by joining other Catholics in making a commitment to participate in restoring the earth! Or at least our little part of it!
