

# From Your Associate PASTOR'S PEN



With Lent (a little more than) halfway over, it's a good time (continue) to take a look at the following psalm, then at our-Lent-selves, then back at the psalm.

Psalms 42:2-3; 43:3-4

As a hart (deer) longs for flowing streams, so longs my soul for thee, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God? Oh send out thy light and thy truth; let them lead me, let them bring me to thy holy hill and to thy dwelling! Then I will go to the altar of God, to God my exceeding joy; and I will praise thee with the lyre, O God, my God.

Are our voluntary Lenten disciplines making our souls thirst for God? Or are they just making our (families) duck into another room when they see us coming?

Are we going towards the altar of God—towards Easter Sunday—with *exceeding joy*, being led by God's light and God's truth? Or are we moaning and grumbling as we head towards who-knows-where?

Lent isn't a time to try to punish ourselves into being deserving of God's grace. (Especially since that's not possible, at Lent or any other time.)

Lent is a time to try to be our best selves, to take up new practices that lead us towards God and to leave behind practices that distract us from God.

If giving up chocolate has left us longing for *chocolate*, rather than for God, perhaps this would be a good time to reassess. When we feel that twinge of desire for sweets, can we use it as a reminder to direct our thoughts towards God? Do we eat a carrot stick AND do some small act of service for someone? Or do we try to fill that sugar-void by shouting at our kids and/or coworkers?

If giving up coffee means that we are too foggy to spend time in morning prayer, perhaps we need to add getting to bed early to our Lenten disciplines. Or maybe now would be the time to try substituting caffeinated tea, instead of just going cold turkey. Maybe just cutting it out is the best approach to your Lent this year, maybe that's what will lead you to God's holy bill

But if your voluntary Lenten disciplines are leading you to hell in a hand-basket instead, you can do something about it! Praise God with your sacrifices today. If we can't do that, then we're not making the right sacrifices.

Where are your voluntary Lenten disciplines taking you today?



# Kid's Corner Fun Fact

In today's Gospel, we hear some of the most famous words in Scripture: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but

might have eternal life" (John 3:16). These words are absolutely AMAZING! Think about it... God loves the world so much that He sent His Son to save it. You see, there are consequences for our sins. That is why we need to be saved. Sin causes death. However, Jesus loves us so much He took on the consequence of death so we can go to heaven. It's a gift! Just like any gift, there is nothing we can do to deserve it. As we prepare for Easter during Lent, we ready our hearts to receive more of that love. We prepare out of thanksgiving for Jesus' death on the cross. Take some time today and think about what you promised to do for Lent – are you keeping up with it? Did you have trouble keeping up with the promise? Did you fail? No matter what, you can choose to continue on even better for the rest of Lent. It's hard, I know, but it is so worth it because God really does love us that much.



# Creating a Catholic Culture

Have you ever been at Mass and have noticed that there are moments where it seems like there is nothing going on... like a downtime in the Liturgy? Our American culture is very pragmatic and likes things to move quickly – that "downtime" in Mass can seem like a waste. I know that I can often

catch my mind wandering in those moments. Yet, at a teaching Mass the middle and high school youth were fortunate enough to be at on March 8th, Fr. Chuck did an amazing job explaining why there are moments where it seems like there is nothing happening. Almost always these moments are preceded with the words, "let us pray." It is our moment in the Mass to turn our heart to the Lord and focus more closely on the prayers of the Mass, to enter in more deeply, and to offer up our own prayers. The Mass is a sacrifice – it re-presents the sacrifice of Christ on Calvary. It is also when we offer up to the Lord, or sacrifice, all of our efforts, our triumphs, our failings, and our intentions before the altar. We give those to the Lord just as we give the bread and the wine to the Lord. Our gifts, just as with the bread and wine, are transformed. We become transformed. We use the moments of silence in the Mass to be able to worship our Lord more fully. Silence is sacred.




