FROM YOUR PASTOR'S PEN



THE SACRED TRIDUUM ---

THE HOLIEST DAYS OF THE YEAR

This coming week we celebrate the three most significant days of our Church Year.

Holy Thursday – The Mass of the Last Supper, when the Eucharist was given to us and when Jesus washed the feet of His disciples, *leaving us two powerful messages for a meaningful life. We are to eat this "bread from heaven," Jesus' glorified Body and Blood, and serve one another.* **This Mass begins at 7:00 p.m.** Following the Mass of the Last Supper there will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 10:00 p.m. in the chapel.

Good Friday – The celebration of the Passion and Death of Jesus on the cross destroys the power of sin for those who are sorry. **The service begins at 1:30 p.m.** and includes the reading of the Passion, Holy Communion and Veneration of the Cross. At 6:30 p.m. there are Stations of the Cross.

Holy Saturday – The greatest liturgy of the entire year. The Easter Fire is lit and blessed outside. From that fire the Easter Candle is lit and processed in the darkness into the church. The Exsultet (the magnificent Resurrection Song) is sung. Our salvation history is proclaimed in a number of biblical stories. Then the waters for baptism are blessed and our baptismal promises renewed. Alleluias are abundantly sung while the candidates are initiated into full communion with our Catholic community through a Profession of Faith, Confirmation and the reception of the Eucharist for the first time. **The Mass begins at 8:00 p.m.** (Earlier on Saturday, at 12:00 p.m., the Blessing of Easter Foods takes place at St. Bruno's. There is a tradition of bringing food to church to be blessed, food which a family will share on Easter, or food which will be shared with the less fortunate.)

NOTE: The Catholic Church does not allow a Mass of anticipation for Easter, so there can be NO Mass before dark on Holy Saturday. Therefore **we are NOT permitted to have a 5:00 Mass of Anticipation.**

Easter Sunday – The continuation of the Alleluias of Holy Saturday's Easter Vigil. **Masses are at 8:00 and 10:00 am.**

Please come and be part of these significant days. These are more than days of remembrance. They are the events of salvation and redemption that are still happening for us. Enter into the mystery of it all and experience the saving power of Christ.

Funerals During the Sacred Triduum

On Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday (April 2-5, 2015), a **funeral Mass may NOT** be celebrated according to the law of the Church. What is permitted, is that **the body of the deceased may be brought to the parish church** and the funeral prayers and final commendations offered, **but these rituals must be celebrated without a Mass or the Eucharist** during the Triduum. The burial commemorations are also permitted at the cemetery. After Easter Sunday, a **Memorial Mass** for the deceased may be scheduled if the family wishes. The death of a loved one is a traumatic experience, and the Church's law on this matter might seem insensitive, but during the Sacred Triduum the only Masses that are permitted are the Holy Thursday Mass of the Last Supper and the great Easter Vigil Mass celebrating the resurrection of Christ on Holy Saturday night. Although Communion is distributed as part of the Good Friday Service, there is no Mass celebrated that day because of the death and burial of Jesus.

Proclamation of Divine Mercy Sunday:

In accordance with the Apostolic Penitentiary Decree on June 29, 2002 a plenary indulgence is granted on Divine Mercy Sunday to all those who receive Eucharistic communion, go to Reconciliation/Confession (within 8 days before or after the feast day), Say the Our Father, and recite a devout prayer such as; "Merciful Jesus, I trust in You." it is requested that the faithful take part in prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy in a complete spirit of detachment from sin, even venial sin. The plenary indulgence grants complete forgiveness of sin and the punishment due to that sin.

Kid's Corner Fun Fact



Today begins the HOLIEST week of the entire year. It is even called Holy week. The most important days of Holy Week are Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. On Holy Thursday we celebrate two very

important beginnings: first Jesus celebrates the first Mass and we receive THE gift of the Eucharist. With this gift, Jesus is ALWAYS with us! It is such a special gift. The other beginning we have on this day is the priesthood. It is the birthday of the priesthood. Without our priests we would not be able to have Mass, Anointing of the Sick or go to Reconciliation. Good Friday is when we remember how much we are worth. We are worth so much that Jesus – who is God – died to save us from sin. That is an amazing love! On Holy Saturday, as it gets dark, the Church prepares to celebrate the night when Jesus goes from death into life. When He rises again, Jesus breaks us free from sin, and because of this we can go to heaven. Talk about a gift! On Easter we are given Heaven.



Creating a Catholic Culture

For many years I have always been captivated by these words from the Easter Vigil: **"O happy fault, O necessary sin of Adam, which gained for us so great a Redeemer!"** These words, rich in meaning, give us much to think about as we prepare to celebrate Easter next Sunday. The gift that God has

given us at the start of it all, free will, has come with greatness. With it we are free to love and to be loved. With it we can choose to know, love and serve God. Yet, with this freedom we have the ability to turn our backs on Him and each other. Remarkably it is because of this ability to turn our backs on God and each other, this weakness if you will, that He became one of us. Likewise, as Jesus hangs on the cross, He cries out to the Father, begging for the Father to forgive us – we know not what we do. It is our individual sin that placed God on the cross on that Friday. And how often do we reflect on the cross. It was our debt, and yet it is Christ who redeemed us. Have a prayerful, reflective Holy Week.
