The ex-officio position of Trustee-Secretary is up for election at this time.

John Morgen is running for re-election. Other nominations are being accepted. This is a two-year term and nominations will close **May 5, 2017**. Directives regarding election of Trustees are contained in the Parish Corporate By-Laws. Parishioners who are considering accepting a nomination for the position of Trustee must be educated about the position. The following is a summary of the corporate By-Laws regarding election of Parish Trustees:

- Candidates must be practicing members and at least 25 years old.
- The pastor may nominate one candidate for each position open. Additional candidates must be nominated in writing by ten or more parish members. (Form in Parish office.)
- Nominations must be completed and announced at the weekend masses prior to the election. If there is only one nominee for the position, nominations are closed and the nominee is declared elected.
- Elections are held every two years by written ballot before and after designated weekend masses.
- The person who receives the highest number of votes will become the Trustee subject to the approval of the Archbishop.

If you have the basic qualifications to serve in the role as parish trustee-secretary, please consider nominating yourself. All nominees must submit a form with 10 signatures, a biography and picture to be used in the bulletin to Fr. Dan, pastor@stpaulgenesee.net by May 5, 2017.

ST. BEN'S

As a parish we have served St. Ben's Community Meal for over 25 years by cooking a beef stew supper each month, thanks to our Loaves and Fishes collections. The Capuchin Community includes St. Ben's and the House of Peace. St. Ben's has many other outreach programs.

In 2016, 1546 bus tickets, 2108 hygiene bags, and 1657 Rx co-pays were provided to people in need. Through House of Peace, 18,485 articles of free clothing went to over 33,000 people (St. Paul's Free Clothing Share supports this wonderful program twice/year!) At least 50 showers per week are also provided to help those homeless in the area of 10th and State Street

Thank you for your generous donations to the Loaves and Fishes collections each month. On the 4th Thursday of the month, our parish beef stew feeds anywhere from 350-500 people in the neighborhood of St. Ben's. What a blessing!

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: At Easter, there were two types of people joining the church: candidates and catechumens. What is the difference?

Answer: People who come to the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) have various backgrounds. Some come to find out about faith: others are baptized in another Christian denomination and are seeking full communion with us; and still others come already knowing they want to be baptized. Those already baptized, who seek full communion with us, are called candidates. Their formation in faith has already begun and they have knowledge of Jesus, the Gospels, and what it means to be a believer. Those who are not baptized need to be formed in faith and develop a relationship with God. They are called catechumens. We do not want to diminish the importance of faith formation by making the RCIA another study session of the catechism. Other elements of church life are also important: community, spirituality, traditions, Scripture, personal commitment to faith, etc. All of these things are discussed and experienced in the RCIA as part of the initiation into the church community. As such, the whole parish becomes part of that process as we invite and welcome people to join us and our church.

Confirmation: Youth at least 16 years of age or adults seeking to be confirmed, call Parish Office.

First Eucharist: Parent and child preparation required. Contact Karen Farrell.

Reconciliation: 2nd & 4th Saturday at 10:00am or by appointment. **Marriage:** Arrangements should be made six months in advance. One of the parties must be a registered parish member and a practicing Catholic. Weddings on Saturdays, 11:00 AM and 2:00 PM, or Friday evenings.

Care of Sick: Sacramental care of the sick, call the Parish Office.

Anointing of the Sick: Call the Parish office with request.
