### WHY DO WE DO THAT?-CATHOLIC TRADITION EXPLAINED

**Question:** In Year B, we hear primarily from the Gospel of Mark. Since each Evangelist has a unique perspective, what are the key issues that Mark addresses in his Gospel?

**Answer:** Gospels are a particular faith community's reflection on Jesus. Each Gospel's author reflected that community's faith in Jesus. Jesus' message is made relevant to the community's situation and context. Mark was the first Gospel to be written. When Matthew and Luke wrote theirs, they imitated and adapted Mark for their communities.

Mark's Gospel seems to be addressed to a faith community undergoing turmoil, rejection, and persecution--forces that threaten to overwhelm them. This provides the context around which Mark fashions the story of Jesus. He presents Jesus as the One sent by God to confront the forces of evil. That is the good news of Jesus.

Jesus' struggle with the demonic forces leads to confrontation, rejection, outright opposition, and a conspiracy to do away with him. Realizing this, Jesus is not deterred. Rather Jesus calls for total faith in God who helps us to overcome the forces of evil. Suffering and even death seem to be the consequences of this struggle. Yet, that is not the end. The one who suffers for the sake of others, the suffering servant, will be the one through whom redemption and salvation will come to all. For Mark, this is what discipleship demands and what true faith in God can and will accomplish. See if you can detect these themes as you read Mark's Gospel.

## Keeping the Faith

### A Generation of Saints

**P** - Pray

**R** - Read Scripture

**E** - Eucharist - receive the Eucharist regularly

It is a humbling experience, being afforded the privilege of being able to read the middle schoolers' journals. At times I am speechless - something that doesn't happen much. But the kids at St. Paul's are truly *that AMAZING!* I thought I would share with you some of what they are saying in their journals. So, get ready to have your socks blown off (order is random)!

"This means that He believes in me and thinks that I will do the right things. He trusts all of us in doing good every day. He doesn't expect us to never sin. But He asks that we will listen when He forgives us." **(7th grade boy)**

"Jesus, I think you're trying to be my friend in ways like helping me stay on track in school and helping me to want to pray and tell you how thankful I am for you and the life I live. Thank you!" **(6th grade girl)**

"Sometimes, I take Jesus' sacrifice for granted. It's not that I'm not thankful, it's just that I grew-up in the faith. I grew-up thinking that for Jesus, that there was the only option. I never thought about all the things Jesus could have done." **(7th grade girl)**

"For me this means I am special and have a place in this world even if I don't think I do. I pray that I can think better about myself and not only see the flaws of myself. I pray that every time I look in the mirror I don't see somebody that I want to change, but somebody to love just the way I am. I pray that God will help me see this." **(8th grade girl)**

"Dear God, If I am worth dying for, then you are, too. I hope you feel the same as me and we can be 'friends'." **(7th grade boy)**

Dear God, I believe that you love me so much that you would die for me. What I think this means is that even though there are so many people in the world you care for each and everyone, including myself..." **(7th grade boy)**

Dear God, thank you for doing this. What do you want me to do to prove that we are worth dying for? Also, thank you for showing you love us in such a way because it makes me feel I never need to change and become someone I am not. It also means that we mean so much to you and that someone will always love us and be with us. I want to make it up and do something great to show we really care about what you did for us" **(6th grade girl)**

"Dear God, I think that you will do everything for the best of us and this means a lot to me. I think everything is worth giving up to you because you gave everything up for me. It makes me feel special when I know that God cares about me (although I already knew that)." **(7th grade girl)**

"This means a lot to me because... if God is willing to die for ME, I feel special/important. I want to have a relationship with God." **(7th grade girl)**

"...It's powerful to think that there's someone in my life that loves me that much [enough to die for]. But I just need to love Him back. It's a free love, though, because I want to." **(8th grade girl)**

I believe that these are the children who will become a generation of saints; a generation that reveals to a lost and hurting world who they are and what they are worth. Please join me in praying for them!


### PRESCHOOL STORY TIME
