

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

This Sunday, Jesus continues his challenging Sermon on the Mount. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you? Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. "Words like these are challenging! Many of us have grown up in a culture of independence and retaliation against those who harm us. Today's Gospel reminds us that the way of the world is not necessarily the way of the disciple.

In many spiritual texts, saints describe the first stage of the spiritual life as mercenary love of God. That is, we love Him because he "pays" us with graces and good things. Consider for a moment, why do you do the good that you do? Take volunteering, for example. How often do we talk about the good feelings service evokes and how you "get so much more than you give." This is still based on an attitude of return on our investment. Would we volunteer if we knew it was good to do, but we didn't "feel" good afterward? What if the people we helped seemed ungrateful, or if someone at the food pantry stole \$20 out of our purse? It can be difficult to love people when we think we might not get anything back. "For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you?"

As Christians, we are called to imitate God. We follow a God who loves not only His closest friends, but who loves betrayers, deniers, and crucifiers. The Christian walk is one of perseverance and sacrifice. What does your love look like?

Parish Mission March 11, 12 6:30-7:30pm. Dr. Dan Scholz, scripture scholar, will speak at both St Bruno and St Paul. Come for one or both nights. The title of the 2019 Parish Mission is "The place where you stand is holy ground" (Exodus 3:5). We will hear about Moses' encounter with God as "holy ground" and tie the life and work of St Paul (Monday night) and Jesus (Tuesday night) to the idea of "holy ground." Each night we will explore how Jesus and Paul envisioned "holy ground" and how these Lenten Scriptures speak to us today as 21st century Catholic Christians. Child care will be provided. Stay for fellowship and snacks after our time together in Church.

Scripture followed by Stations of the Cross

Does God speak to you when you pray? How does Scripture speak to you? Join us on Friday nights before Stations of the Cross if you want to hear how God speaks to you directly through Scripture. Join Deacon Joe Senglaub for an INTRODUCTION to *Lectio Divina* on Friday, 3/8. Each week Deacon Joe will provide an opportunity for *Lectio Divina*. In Christianity, *Lectio Divina* (Latin for "Divine Reading") is a traditional Benedictine practice of scriptural reading, meditation, and prayer intended to promote communion with God and to increase the knowledge of God's word. It does not treat scripture as texts to be studied, but as the living Word. Join Deacon Joe for *Lectio Divina* followed by Stations of the Cross at 6pm. THE FIRST LECTIO DIVINA SESSION IS A ONE HOUR INTRODUCTION beginning at 5pm on March 8. After that, *Lectio Divina* will begin at 5:30pm, followed by Stations of the Cross at 6pm.

Good Friday Walk the Labyrinth

Good Friday you can walk the Labyrinth in St Paul's gym right before or right after the Good Friday service at St Paul. Labyrinths are circular walkways created from sacred geometry. They symbolize the path of the soul through life. Labyrinths have been around for more than 4,000 years and are found in every religious tradition. It is a way for one to walk a pilgrimage without having to travel to Jerusalem. "Walking the labyrinth clears the mind and gives insight into the spiritual journey. It urges action. It calms people in the throes of life transitions. It helps them see their lives in the context of a path, a pilgrimage. The experience is different for everyone because each of us brings our unique hopes, dreams, history, and longings of the soul." (Walking a Sacred Path by Dr. L. Artress).

Easter Vigil: Join in us celebrating with our RCIA group as they receive sacraments for the first time Saturday, April 20, at St Paul.

Movie Nights during the Easter Season: Watch for more information about dates and times to gather to for a movie about some "Pivotal Players" in the Catholic Church. Bishop Robert Barron's film series illumines a handful of saints, artists, mystics, and scholars who not only shaped the life of the Church but changed the course of civilization. Movie nights will alternate between St Bruno and St Paul. **Power in My Hands**, an internationally released, locally produced movie about the rosary, will also be on the list. RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

I sometimes spend more money than I should. I make decisions based upon my wants and not my needs. Those actions can create a financial difficulty or circumstance where more sacrifice is needed. Instant gratification or selfish impulses can create havoc in one's bank account, marriage, or family. All these issues to deal with simply because I wanted what I wanted and I got it. Yes, it sounds like the actions of a child.

However, I know I am not alone. We all can easily find ourselves acting in this manner. This is why it struck me to listen once again to the words of Jesus when he says, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." The words are reminiscent of another of Jesus' phrases, "Love your neighbor as yourself." The problem is that too often I would like for others to fulfill my wants instead of needs, and I can seemingly love myself by doing what I already mentioned above.

A stewardship way of life means that I wisely steward what I have, and I cannot give what I do not have. Have you ever given someone a present you couldn't afford and think that was love? It wasn't. We don't show love by giving what we do not possess. We show love by meeting another's needs and by sharing our very self with them. At our core, what we long for from others more than anything else is love. Would I have others give me lavish gifts and shower me with empty compliments or would I have them give to me something much more valuable: the love in their hearts?
