Weekly Message



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope John Paul II proclaimed to the world that "from now on throughout the Church this Sunday will be called Divine Mercy Sunday."

Pope John Paul had actively promoted the message of St. Faustina. In his 1980 encyclical on God's mercy, *Rich in Mercy*, he developed a scriptural and doctrinal basis for our faith in the mercy of God. By linking the revealed truth about God's mercy to one of the most solemn Sundays after Easter itself, he illumined the fact that the liturgy already proclaimed the divine mercy. The truth has been embedded for two millennia in the worship of the Church. Once again we see an illustration of the ancient saying, "The law of faith is the law of prayer."

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the responsorial psalm and Gospel for Cycles A, B and C center on the theme of mercy. In Psalm 118 we sing three times, "His mercy endures forever." The Gospel, from John 20:19-31, begins with the risen Christ appearing to the apostles on Easter night. Jesus calms his disciples by saying and giving them "Peace." He shows them the scars of his Passion, his wounded hands and side. His glorified body retains the evidence of his saving work through his suffering, death and resurrection.

He fills them with joy and again says to them—and produces in them—"Peace." Then he breathes on them and explains what the divine breathing means with the words, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." He gives the apostles the power of God's mercy for the sinner, the gift of forgiving sins from God's treasury of mercy. The other texts speak of healing and give the assurance there is nothing to fear.

You might have seen the image of Jesus standing with one hand outstretched in blessing, the other clutching the side wounded by the spear, from which proceed beams of falling light, red and white in color. An explanation of these colors was given to Sister Faustina by Jesus himself saying, "The two rays represent blood and water." This has been attributed to the "blood and water" referenced in the [Gospel of John](#), (John 19:34) and which is also mentioned in the optional of the Chaplet. The words "Jesus I Trust in Thee" He gave her a chaplet to be recited and said that it was appropriate to pray the chaplet at three o'clock each afternoon (the Hour of Great Mercy).



Human Concerns

Thank you very much to the parishioners of St. Paul for your wonderful generosity in connection with the 2019 Easter food basket ministry!

Through your goodness, 182 people in 41 households enjoyed a complete Easter dinner last Sunday. As a result of the collections taken during Lent, and a St. Paul School food drive, we received 89 cans of green beans, 95 cans of mushroom soup, 32 containers of french fried onions, 60 boxes of scalloped potato mixes, 91 cans of pineapple, 23 cans of yams, 64 bags of candy, 20 Easter egg dye kits, and \$1,010 in cash. The money was used to buy hams, rolls, eggs, butter, carrots and pies.


WORK & PRAY

Keeping the Faith She Leads Us to the Fire

- P - Pray everyday
- R - Read Scripture daily
- E - Eucharist - go to Mass and receive it weekly
- P - Participate in Parish life - we need you

- R - Reach out to the Least
- e - evangelize - share Jesus with others



Last week as we prepared to enter into the sacred mysteries of the Triduum and Easter, the world saw what has been one of the most iconic monuments of faith (if not *the most* iconic) ablaze. **The Cathedral of Notre Dame was on fire - it stunned the world.** At first, I admit, I almost didn't believe it.

You see, I found out shortly after leaving the mom's group. Our mom's group is reading *33 Days to Morning Glory* by Fr. Michael Gaitley. This is a preparation for something called the Marian Consecration to Jesus through Mary. The idea behind it is that Mary, as the Mother of God, is the closest person to Him. She is united to Him through a special bond and wants nothing more than to help Jesus bring souls to Himself. **So, she, in a sense, lifts us up and helps us reach Jesus.**

And then I saw the news... **the cathedral of Notre Dame is aflame.** Notre Dame, for those of you who may have forgotten, is translated into English as **Our Lady.** It is **the title** we give to the **Blessed Mother** to show her **the reverence and respect the Mother of God deserves.** After the initial shock, I had a sense of sadness. **But then I saw something which gave way to a far greater hope - people on their knees praying the Rosary and singing Ave Maria while they were before the fire.** It got me thinking... (which admittedly can be both dangerous and result in lengthy emails) isn't this just like Mary? She who burned with love for God so much His Son took on flesh within her womb - thus being able to bring Jesus to world - continues to do so even now. **In the burning cathedral, I see how Mary burns with love for each of us - desiring nothing more than to bring us to her Son.** And in this fire, that is exactly what is happening.

Something many people may not know... in France the Church is dying. Very few people practice their faith, go to Mass or receive the Sacraments - including not having their children baptized.

And so, **amidst the fires of our lives, Our Mother wants nothing more than to lead us into the even greater fire of Christ's love.** May we follow Our Mother Mary into those flames - the flames of His love. These flames restore us to life - these are the flames which refine our souls to be the perfect image God had in store for us the moment we were conceived in our own mothers' womb.

Pray for us o holy Mother of God...That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ...


