### **Faith Formation**

There is this scene in the movie, *The Lion King*, which has been coming to me a lot lately. It's the scene where Simba is looking at the stars and

suddenly a vision of Mufasa, Simba's father, appears. Mufasa questions his son why he has forgotten him? Simba tries to deny it, but the truth is, by abandoning his place in the lion pride, he has "forgotten" his father. He does not live like he is the son of a king. He lives like a coward who is afraid to be who he was destined to be. As Mufasa leaves the vision, he urges Simba, "Remember who you are!"



So... if I were to tell you to remember who you are, what would come to your mind? Would you remember that you are chosen by God, an adopted son or daughter of the Most High God, who is heir to His kingdom? Would you remember that you come from a long line of men and women who would rather die than deny Jesus? Would you remember that their willingness to die for what they believe is an ever present reminder that what we believe is not ONLY worth dying for, it's also something for which to live? Do you remember that we also have trail-blazers who went before us, beginning hospitals and schools and transforming the world into a place that is kinder and more gentle and a little more holy? Would you remember that Jesus came to die and to rise to save YOU? Would you remember that you have lineage that goes even further back... all the way to the Garden where God put our First Parents and that He delighted because He would one day be able to create YOU and be in relationship with YOU?

What would the Church be like if we remember this with a greater fervor? What would our parish be like if we collectively remembered who we are and where we come from?

## What would our lives look like if we lived and breathed this reality on a daily basis?

We are loved. And yet how often do we keep this status in our minds and on our hearts? It is so easy to forget. Life knocks us down a lot. And, we are sinners. We do things that are not worthy of our adoption as sons and daughters of God. And, to be honest, our **sinfulness often stems** from forgetting who we are.

I lived a long time struggling with the idea that I was a beloved child of God. Intellectually, I knew all of the theology and could recite the passages, but the truth is it could not penetrate my broken heart. A heart that was broken from sin - both mine and others. So all of those promises in Scripture, they were true... but not for me.

But then, something happened. God sent people into my life to speak Jesus to and it began to penetrate my heart. No longer did I see myself as someone outside of God's love, but rather an integral part of HIS family. A part that is beloved.

The same is true for you. No matter what you think or feel about yourself, no matter what lies you have been told, or what lies you have told to yourself. Your existence gives glory to the God of the universe, and to deny that is to deny His glory.

So, remember who you are.

### **Adult Formation**

### What is YOUR purpose?

Today's second reading reminds us that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose. PURPOSE: the feeling of being determined to do or achieve something. (dictionary.com). So what is YOUR purpose? St. Paul goes on to say that we are to be conformed to the image of his Son. There's a purpose for you! This reminds those of a certain age of the Baltimore Catechism: God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him forever in the next.

We BELONG to Him – we were baptized and adopted into the Trinity through the gift of the Holy Spirit. Living in our family of faith helps us belong. Sharing faith brings us unity (pause here for a word from our parish: pray about joining a small group!). As we get to know Him, we come to belong more and more to Him – and unity with the Head of the Body of Christ brings unity in the entire body of Christ. We belong to each other. *On* purpose. For HIS purpose - to be in

relationship with Him.



Through the gift of creation of the world, this bumblebee was created for a significant purpose – cross pollination. Without his gift, the world will be missing something so important (about 1/3 of our food crop depends on pollinators).

Are you living your purpose? BEE (sorry I just cannot resist) conformed to the image of His Son, BEE the light of Christ, BEE loving, BEE His presence in the world. The world is missing something if you aren't living your purpose!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have always been inspired by those who achieve a level of intellectual, athletic, artistic or economic superiority. You know that it took a great deal of work and effort; rightfully, the society holds them up as role models. However, without a doubt, the most influential impact on my life has been by those who exercised kindness in any field I was engaging in. It's not that any of the achievements of role models in various fields are less important, but without kindness, those achievements lose a sense of connectedness.

It has been through the kindness of others that I was encouraged to strive for goals. Embedded in the sense of kindness is the care of others. In college, it was the kind teacher who encouraged me to consider law studies and did so to the advantage of the Church that I love. In high school, it was the kind English teacher who took the time to critique my creative writing and share his passion for literature that this LOA, as well as many of my homilies, respect the written word and its influence. It was the kindness of a college baseball teammate who consoled me after a two error game to shake it off and come back the next day, helping me to get over my self-pity and see the larger responsibility to the team. In my priesthood, and as a bishop, I have been the recipient of many acts of kindness by women, men and children, which has shaped my priestly ministry and made me a better Christian.

I believe at the root of our Christian faith is kindness. Kindness is more than empathy. Empathy identifies with another person, but with kindness, there is outreach and an act of goodwill. Kindness moves one to speak or act on behalf of another person, who really has no obligation to do so.

I imagine that one of the attractive traits of Jesus was His kindness. You hear in the Gospels that He was moved to pity for the crowd; he cured them, he fed them and he preached to them. He owed them nothing; in fact, they owed Him. Kindness doesn't always receive a thank you. Did the couple at the wedding feast send Him a note of gratitude for the wine? Even on the cross, Christ did not think of Himself but of Dismas, reassuring the good thief of his place in paradise.

Our society could use a strong dose of kindness. We are so politicized that we are unable to give simple praise for a job well done or support for leadership efforts on behalf of our nation without accusations that bespeak partisan politics.

Part of evangelization starts with a sense of kindness. There is a balance in kindness. We want to be a member of a Christian community that reflects a sense of kindness that contributes and builds up rather than wastes or tears down. We can easily practice kindness by the way we LOVE ONE ANOTHER.


