

The View from the Back of the Line

Have you known that person? The one who leaves every person they encounter feeling a little more blessed for having met them? They're the friend you can count on when nothing is going well. They're the one who's always "doing" for others. They're never gossiping or sniping or complaining.

We wonder how they do it, how they have it in them. We're a little envious, even if we don't let ourselves acknowledge it.

That, folks, is what the view is like from the front of the line, gazing at those suckers in the way back and wondering why they're smiling so much.

We've all been at the front of a line and felt no shame about it. 

Faith Formation

Today is Monday, September 13, 2021 and I am having a lot of trouble trying to figure out how to share my thoughts today. So much has been floating around in my head, and I just don't really know how to get it all out in a coherent way.

I have to begin with the reality that I am a little troubled. I am troubled with the way we in the United States take so much for granted. We live in a world of superabundance. Yet, we live lives that are often depleted, worn out and wanting. Speaking for myself, I know when I indulge myself in the superabundant, worldly pleasures, I have a hollow feeling within me. And the thing is, so often if we turn towards the Gospel and live fearlessly the way Jesus calls us to, we would understand what it means to be fully alive. But instead we seek passing pleasures in hopes that we may be numbed by our lack of feeling fulfilled.



Luckily, we have an antidote for this: sacrifice. Sacrifice is the school of love. If you do not believe me, consider this: the Church is growing in places like the Middle East where it costs something, really costs something, to say "yes" to following Jesus. We may, at times, experience people judging us for our beliefs, but we rarely are truly forced to choose between life and death, complete rejection from family and friends, or imprisonment or torture. Yet, the "yes" of those persecuted

Christisans encourages me to try to follow Jesus more fully. They reveal to me how "worth it" a life lived for Christ truly is.

I think one reason people often complain about Christians in this country is because we are unwilling to truly sacrifice our comfort for the Gospel. It is very easy to have an opinion about why X,Y or Z happened or have strong opinions about a particular issue. It is entirely another affair to roll up your sleeves and be Jesus in the situation. And that "being Jesus" part is often uncomfortable. It requires us to put our ego, pride and opinion on the back burner and serve as Jesus did - in love and humility.

It also means we need to re-align our desires to match the desires of Jesus. It may mean we say "no" to some things that we allow to crowd our schedule. It's not a "no" for the sake of a "no." It's a "no" for the sake of something better - Jesus. If our lives look exactly like the lives of the rest of the world, living the same values and following the same schedules... Why believe in Jesus?

I choose to believe in Jesus for the sake of all of the martyrs who died giving witness to their faith and love for Hlm. The martyrs in history and the ones living now remind us that not only is our faith worth dving for, it's something for which we can live. And in fact, I might even add, it is only when we fully embrace Jesus to the point of being willing to sacrifice, we begin to realize just how fully alive (c.f. John 10:10) He desires us to be. August 31, 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

For 23 years I served as a chaplain in the United States Army Reserves. I was activated a few times for service with the regular Army. In 1991, I was activated for Operation Desert Storm, and prepared to enter the country referred to as the "theater of action." However, I never left the U.S. since the war quickly ended. I also served in a few special deployments in support of military exercises. I was proud to serve our country, and privileged to be side-by-side with the men and women who were dedicated to protecting our country and the freedoms we enjoy. Rarely does a month go by that I am not contacted by a former member of one of the units I served or a person from Fort Sheridan, Illinois, and Fort McCoy, Wisconsin, which made up my congregations.

Therefore, it pained me to see the return from Afghanistan of our young men and women in the flag-draped coffins. There is always an understanding by service personnel who are placed in harm's way that it could mean the loss of their lives. As a chaplain, I remember having to inform a family of the loss of a loved one due to an accident that took place stateside. It was gut wrenching, to say the least; to lose a son or brother is a terrible tragedy. It was only my sense of faith that offered some consolation to the grieving family. God's love brings us hope, even during the darkest moments of our lives.

This last week was a reminder of the men and women who willingly place their lives in the line of fire to protect us. The oldest service member of the thirteen that were lost was thirty-one years of age. Their lives were still ahead of them. We sometimes can be very cavalier about our lives and the freedoms that we enjoy. For those that stand in the breach - whether these men and women are Army, Navy, Marine, Air Force or Coast Guard —- they are the deterrent to the enemies who desire to deny our way of life and steal from us our freedoms.

I remember a chaplain telling me of a religious sister that was a catechist instructing the children of the military personnel. She was an avowed pacifist. When asked how she could devote her time to teaching the children of the military soldiers that are trained for war, she proudly responded that she knows that Jesus offered his life for her salvation, and it is only in military personnel that she also sees willingness to lay down their life to protect hers. She does what she does in gratitude.

I was disturbed by the coffins of those thirteen service members. But, it also made me proud to know that the spirit that moved them to represent our country was a noble act that demonstrated a willingness to defend and affirm the freedoms of the country that we love. No one was burning these flags; no one was defaming these flags or dragging them in protest. These flags simply draped the coffins of our brothers and sisters as a sign of honor that supported the very best of those among us, and a reminder of why patriotic men and women get so upset when the flag is abused.

These men and women of our military have my respect and gratitude, but they also have my prayers. To the thirteen brought home, "Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord and may perpetual light shine upon them..." They represent an example for all of us of our responsibility to LOVE ONE ANOTHER.




