

Weekly Message



Gospel Meditation

Encouraging Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Deserts can be lonely, isolated, and treacherous places. When a person wanders in a desert, they can easily get disoriented, dehydrated, confused, lost, and vulnerable. Temptation is at its peak, especially when confronted with something that may offer some respite or relief, even a mirage. Deserts can bring us to our weakest moment and tempt our faith. The Christian journey can be described as a desert experience as we vacillate back and forth, falling victim to the mirages of our lives versus the true, life-giving water offered by God. We need a burning bush experience in our lives that convinces us of the power of God and reveals Him as the "I am" of all existence.

Moses was leading his flock across the desert when he found himself at Mount Horeb. Mountains give us a fuller perspective of life, a panoramic view of what would otherwise be hidden from the limitations of our sight. That's when Moses met God. We have to find our way to a mountain experience where our vantage point can take on a wider view of life. Many things can do this for us: the birth of a child, the death of someone we love, the joy that comes from marveling at the beauty of God's work, the pondering of life's mysteries, and the ache of longing found deep within our souls. There are many things in life that can wake us up, give us a clearer, better view of things and become occasions where a bush may burn and God's presence as the eternal uncreated One is revealed.

God is very patient and gives us the time and space we need to figure things out and bear some good fruit. He doesn't rush to cut us down or get frustrated with our barrenness. But we have to remember that the desert journeys of our lives come with some risks. The major risk is that we will mistakenly believe that the mirages are real. Thus, we fall victim to thinking that the respite and refreshment we seek is discovered in a place other than where it actually is. Our faith and the life of the Church are the safeguards we need to keep us properly orientated so that we don't get lost or confused and stay on course. ©LPi

Communion For The Homebound

Since COVID began we have had an increase in the number of parishioners taking communion to the homebound and we applaud everyone for helping with this ministry. Being able to receive the Eucharist when we are incapable of being in Church or when we have health issues brings joy and community to all involved. There are, however, rules we must follow when distributing the Eucharist outside of Mass. I ask that all who participate in this ministry follow the Church procedures so we do not violate Church law.

First, please request from the parish or purchase an approved pyx that either a deacon or a priest can bless for you (required). Be sure you take the Eucharist directly to the recipients as soon as possible after leaving the Church and do not leave the Eucharist outside of your possession at any time. When you carry the Eucharist please be reverent and do not engage in any activity that would be inappropriate or disrespectful. Please clean and consume all fragments of the Eucharist within the pyx immediately after communion has been delivered and remember **never** can you take the Eucharist overnight.



When giving communion please recognize you are providing a very important ministry. Be considerate and respectful to all you with whom you come in contact. And lastly, begin with prayer and end with prayer as you deliver communion to the homebound.

We are grateful for your service as ministers of the Church to our separated sisters and brothers in our community. Remember they are always in our prayers and in our hearts until we can all meet again in person. Thank you, Deacon Joe Senglaub

Faith Formation

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once told of a story that greatly inspired him.

It inspires me as well. This tale, which I will soon relate to you, is yet another reason why I choose to be Catholic.

As the Cultural Revolution spread throughout China, there was a small rural village where there were many devout Catholics. The communists came to this particular town and ransacked the Church. They arrested the priest (in his own home and thus was able to witness the rest of the tale), desecrated the church, confiscated the Tabernacle and threw the Eucharist on the floor. **There were 32 Hosts... laying on the ground... 32 True Presences of Jesus Christ laying about the ground - waiting to be trampled upon.** However, there was a young girl who witnessed it all. **Heartbroken, every night for 32 days she snuck into the Church to bow down and receive one of the precious Hosts upon her tongue and leave. On the last day, the guard awoke and he beat her to death.**

History has not recorded her name.

But in heaven, **she is a celebrated hero; a warrior for the Kingdom of God!** For she saw the Lord and realized it, and in Him she saw someone worth staking her life upon.

She is a saint!

The saints have always captivated my attention. In every day and in every age **God draws near to the people He created** (c.f. CCC 1). He woos people (sometimes the most unlikely) into a relationship with Him. **Their souls, alive beyond anything the world can do to enliven them, are given entirely back to the One who died so we might live. In accepting this love, they go out and transform the world.**

And what's more, these saints whom we give laud, show us what living life fully alive in Christ looks like in every day and in every age. And thankfully, there is no "one type of saint" in the Church. We have saints who have been great sinners (just take a look at St. Paul. Scripture tells us he was breathing murderous thoughts against the followers of Christ, c.f. Acts 9:1) and saints who grew up in saintly families (St. Therese of Lisieux). We have saints who were queens (Elizabeth of Hungary, Helena, Clotilde, Adelaide, Elizabeth of Portugal, Jadwiga of Poland) and who were slaves (St. Josephine Bakhita, Servant of God Augustus Tolton and Servant of God Julia Greeley). There are saints who wrote history by their bravery (St. Joan of Arc, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare of Assisi and St. John Paul II), and there are saints who died at a young age (St. Francisco, St. Jacinata, St. Jose Sanchez del Rio, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassiti, Blessed Chiara Badano, and Blessed Carlo Accutis). **No matter their story, saints also remind me that regardless of what is going on in the world, life with Christ is far more valuable and worthy of a pursuit than anything this world can offer. This world only offers the temporal, but Jesus offers us the eternal.**

And, if I had to pick a favorite saint... I usually go with St. Therese of Lisieux or St. Edith Stein... but in truth, **it is often the saints who are unnamed that inspire me the most.** Why? Because they lived their lives for Christ *even when nobody was watching*.

They lived for Him no matter what - upon this earth, the only glory they received is the love and admiration of their families, friends and other loved ones. **And yet, the angels rejoiced at their walking into heaven!**

And to be honest, this is most likely the type of saint that I will become. I do not harbor any real thought that in 100 years or so there will be Cathedrals, or even a country parish, named after me. And, that is ok. **So long as I can see Jesus face to face!**

Reconciliation: 2nd & 4th Saturday at 10:00am or by appointment.

Marriage: Arrangements should be made six months in advance. One of the parties must be a registered parish member and a practicing Catholic.
