


## Gospel Meditation

### Encouraging Deeper Understanding of Scripture

God's love story reveals itself in our stories, experiences, and aspirations. We are all prodigal sons and daughters. There are many times in our lives when we would "sell our souls" in order to pursue our passions. We pursued what we wanted without regard for others or God. We have sowed our oats, thrown ourselves into careless pleasures, spent what we know we ought to have saved, turned our backs on those we love and abused gifts we have been given. We even hit bottom and realized the silliness and self-destruction of it all. We needed to come home. We knew we erred and needed a gentle presence to show us God's unconditional love. This wayward journey home changed us.

As much as we need to be welcomed, we are also the one who needs to do the welcoming and mercy giving. Those we love need our guidance, but they don't always take it. We know that what they are doing is off the mark, self-destructive



and wrong. We have to let them go and let it happen, even though they might get hurt. As we wait and hope, they choose to make their way back to us. They don't need us to judge them. They have done enough of that to themselves. We immediately embrace them and are just happy they're home. God uses us to help heal them. Knowing how much we craved understanding and forgiveness ourselves, we can now freely give it away. God uses what he has taught us to teach others.

We are also the entitled ones. At least we "think" we are entitled. After all, we work hard for what we have. We cannot get our heads around the idea that someone can get something that I really deserve! If I do what I'm supposed to do, I ought to be rewarded for that, right? If I do something wrong, I ought to pay the consequences. This is justice, isn't it? This is not God's justice. God is all about love, mercy, compassion, and forgiveness. God's justice is love freely given without merit. We carry the stories of the prodigal son, the unconditional forgiving father, and the entitled angry brother with us. When we make friends with all three, humbly telling those stories to others makes us Christ's ambassadors. ©LPi

## Adult Faith Formation

*If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.*

(Romans 10)

This verse from the start of Lent is still rolling around in my heart. As a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, *this season is meant to be a time to have things roll around in our hearts.* Without reflection on our actions, change cannot occur. Do you sometimes feel like the prodigal son...wandering, searching, and lost, on the outs or at odds with someone? Through experience and reflection, the son in today's Gospel came to realize what he had walked away from and how wrong he had been. At this halfway point in Lent, spend time in reflection. How are you doing? Our Heavenly Father is always ready and willing to welcome us into an even deeper relationship, just like the father in the parable.

If you are still wandering and searching, come walk the labyrinth during Holy Week at the St Paul gym, dates below.

Praying the labyrinth is a way to get closer to Jesus. The labyrinth is a very old way of praying while you walk; you can think of it as taking a walk with God or with Jesus. While you walk, you might think about how you can live out that verse above. While you are walking in, you can think of what you need to leave behind, what things in your life keep you from being close to God? When you reach the center, you might just sit or stand and rest for a few minutes. Listen for and feel God's presence within you. What do you want to say to Jesus? Then simply follow the path back out. On the way out you might think about what Jesus wants you to do in your life. The Holy Spirit has given you the power to *confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord, [to] and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, [and to] be saved.* Tell someone the good news, especially during Holy Week! Invite them to walk with you. Invite them to one of our Holy Week services. Come feel the power of walking with our Lord during Holy Week:

## Faith Formation

Life is so hard. There are times of unadulterated beauty that permeates our days, but so often we find our days long. **In short, we suffer.** There has been, I think, a lie within Christianity that you cannot suffer or have a hard time. To do so is to lack faith. It's a lie of the devil to get us to believe that our lives of faith are a sham. However, nothing could be farther from the truth. In John 16:33, **Jesus tells us that in this life we WILL have trouble - but don't fret... because He has overcome this world.** Our struggles are a chance to unite our lives with Jesus upon the cross. And, in doing this, I see another reason to love being Catholic.

**The Seventh Station is so apropos for the life of faith.** We are in the middle of a great journey upwards. Whilst doing so, we carry the crosses we have been given in life: mental illness, a sick child, loss of a job, enduring the pandemic and all of the civil strife of the last several years, and the list can go on and on. The difficulties always arise. It's one of the sureties of life of which we can be certain. And often while we trudge along in life we falter and fall. In the moments when we are on the ground, we have a choice to make... Do we continue on this path of faith with all of the other "things in our life"? How can we continue on?

**And then in one swift moment, when I am lying on the ground wondering where I will have the strength to get back up and continue on, I think of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane or on the Cross.** In both places I see the God I have given my life to and whom I love above all else, and I know that suffering has a point, somehow. I can give Him my suffering, my difficulties big or small, and know that somehow they are transformed into a prayer, a sacrifice for others. And in some way doing this always alleviates some of the suffering. In giving it to Jesus, **He takes it on Himself and carries the load with me.** There is a hurt that can heal with its pain (Rich Mullins). It is found on the cross.



**The act of uniting our sufferings with the Lord is an ancient tradition of 'offering up' our pains to the Lord.** Some of the greatest saints chose to look for suffering. This was not because they were masochists or lovers of pain. It's because as they suffered, they realized their need for Jesus in a real and profound way. And while it is hard, it is also sweet to realize how much you need the Lord.

Lent is, in a way, a period of collective suffering. We give things up - and the things we give up ought to be hard. Otherwise, it's not really a sacrifice. So, as we continue on in Lent, may we unite ourselves ever more to Jesus.

March 15, 2022 Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Modern technology provides instant and vivid depictions of every event happening throughout the world. The recent war in the Ukraine has been extremely disturbing and unsettling. We live in a world where the effects of war are presented to us in living color every night. It's not a video game where worlds are destroyed, and people killed or injured, and then someone hits a reset button and everything returns to normal. This is reality – people die, individuals are injured, families are separated, children cry from hunger, towns and cities destroyed.

There is truth to the statement that "war is hell." It presents the worst of humanity. However, there is a presentation of courage that is at the heart of the best of us. The determination to be free at the cost of one's life. The willingness to sacrifice possessions to contribute to the resistance, to stand in the face of insurmountable odds, to declare loyalty to the nation.

We all feel helpless in this struggle. Yet, it is faith that allows us to support the freedom and righteousness of a people through our prayers. Prayers *do* make a difference, and it is the many prayers of the people of the Ukraine, joined to the prayers of the people throughout the world, that allows us to place our trust in the one Lord who can bring peace to these troubled times. We pray also for the Russian people, who I believe do not want war but instead seek the diplomatic avenues necessary for peace.

The Ukrainian War is asking a very important question: do we have the resolve to protect the freedoms that we enjoy as a people? There were lives, blood and sacrifice given in the defense of the country. As a nation, we were fashioned through the bravery of the men and women who understood the cost of freedom. We enjoy today freedoms because they sacrificed. Every age must make a conscious choice to preserve the way of life that has been gifted to us and the identity we share as a nation.

I have often said that our Founding Fathers gave us a gift. They established our rights not by human contract but rather through inalienable rights given by God. The first right they recognized was the freedom of religion. We are called to understand that we all have a responsibility greater than allegiance to our society – we have a responsibility before God.

Perhaps at this time our prayers can be focused on the conversion of the leaders of the aggressive actions which endanger the peace and well-being of millions.

Where there is hatred, let me sow love;  
where there is injury, pardon;  
where there is doubt, faith;  
where there is despair, hope;

to be loved as to love.


For it is in giving that we receive;
