
Weekly Message



Gospel Meditation

Encouraging Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In creative celebration of the Most Holy Trinity, pray a rosary with creation. Find a quiet place outside or sit near a window. Contemplate the amazing Divine Gift that is before you. Admire it. Study it. Become one with it. Ask for the guidance of Brother St.



Francis as you pray: "You, Holy Father, are King of heaven and earth. You are three in one, God above all gods. You are good, all good, and supreme good, Lord God, living and true. You are love. You are beauty. You are gentleness. You are joy. You are hope and happiness." Admire the wonder and majesty of God in all that is around you. Ask for wisdom and understanding.

Begin each decade with the Our Father and conclude with the Glory Be.

Decade one: Contemplate God the Father. As you pray each bead with a Hail Mary, get lost in the grandeur of all that you see. Imagine the thousands and thousands of years of history that is before you. Envision a time when nothing existed. What is nothing? Lift your eyes, heart, and soul to the power and magnificence of the universe, its expanse and its endlessness. You are one with it all. God's creative power.

Decade two: Contemplate God the Son. Behold the squirrels, birds, and critters all conducting life's business. They have heartbeats just like yours. Praying each bead, become one with the incarnate divine life that flows through you and flows with the smallest of creatures. It is holy innocence and blessed life. Tenderness. Compassion, Mercy. Reverence. All want to be held, have a home, and be loved. God in all things. Emmanuel.

Decade three: Contemplate God the Holy Spirit. The changing of times and seasons happens often without notice. It is all within God's care and guided. We all belong. Behold the living, dying, and rising to new life. You are one with all time from beginning into eternity.

Decade Four: Contemplate God as One.

Decade Five: Contemplate God as three. All different while remaining one. The divine dance is being danced before you. Rest in what you see. Become what you see. We are all connected: God of the Holy Trinity, creation, our brothers and sisters, the animals, and the plants.

The rosary you have prayed celebrates the circle of connectedness and the intimate relationship we share with all things: a glimpse of the Trinity. ©LPI




Youth Faith Formation

The last time I wrote an email and sent it out, it was about abortion and building a culture of life. So, too, this will be.

We need to be the change this world needs. Because, as much as prayer is wonderful, if we never live our faith out loud or in real life... it will never be enough.

We have a God who loved us enough to DO something to save us. It cost Him a lot. His belief that we were worth saving took Him to the cross. If we want to change the world in a manner where days like May 24th, the day of the school shooting in Uvalde, TX, never happen, we need to be willing to sacrifice.

British writer, G.K. Chesterton once said, "**the Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting, it has been found difficult and left untried.**" I count myself first in the line of people who have not truly tried Christianity to its fullest. I don't pray as I ought, I am too easily distracted at Mass and during prayer, and at home, I have desired comfort far more than greatness. And yet, "**we were not made for comfort,**" as Pope Benedict reminds us, "**we are made for greatness.**"



God has placed us in this time and place for a reason - **to fall so madly in love with Him that we cannot help but love others so well they encounter His love through you and me.** He placed us here to be the saints of today so that the world may see us and give glory to God (c.f. Matthew 5:16).

It is a tall order. And we cannot do it alone. First and foremost, **we must buckle down and get serious about our prayer life.** It's not optional. We will never be who we're destined to be if we don't pray.

Second, we need to **be serious about Mass.** We need to receive Jesus and His blessings. That only happens at Mass. It is there we will be given the strength and courage to live in a way so profound the world sees Jesus in us.

Third, we need to **be Church.** We need each other to build one another up. We need each other because, "**iron sharpens iron**" (Proverbs 27:17) and together we are stronger and better. We, as believers, need to create a community to which we belong so we can strengthen one another.

Adult Faith Formation

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Too often the Trinity is dismissed as a mystery that we can never understand. While we can never solve the mystery of the Trinity, we can KNOW it. Doctrine is meant to help us understand. The doctrine of the Trinity helps us to understand the God in whose image we are made: **a God who is, in essence, loving relationship** – three persons in one God. This means that, as people made in God's image, we are called to live in loving relationship with all people – to truly be community.

Three-leaf clovers are fine, but the real message of the Trinity has to do with *how* we live. **The doctrine of the Trinity calls us to live in loving relationship with one another just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are, in essence, loving relationship.**

Fourth, **we need to be Church.** We are not meant to be an inward turning entity, we are meant to be going out to bring Jesus into the world. We are meant to be the **salt of the earth** - the way God reaches into business, politics, coffee shops, schools, buses, police stations and prisons. We are called to be Jesus to the world. We are called to be missionaries - to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Some will do it in far off lands and others will do it in their neighborhoods.

*We cannot **not** be the people God has destined us to be. The cost is too great. If you can't do it for our society, then do it for your children, and their children, and their children's children....*

Do it because He loved you so much, you can't help but love others in return.

GENEROUS OUTREACH

The heart of our parish outreach is the lived action to which we are all called. At each Human Concerns meeting we pray (adapted from a prayer of St Teresa of Avila): **Christ has no body now but ours. No hands, no feet on earth but ours. Ours are the eyes through which He looks compassion on this world. Ours are the feet with which He walks to do good. Ours are the hands through which He blesses all the world. Ours are the hands, ours are the feet, ours are the eyes, WE are His body. Christ has no body now on earth but ours.**


