

As we age, time seems to pass more quickly. Years seemingly fly by as one holiday flows into the next, January quickly becomes December and life maintains its hectic pace.
What do we ac-



complish in all of that busyness? 

Merry Christmas!

Today Catholics around the world gather to begin their Christmas Celebration by attending Mass as a family. We are SO happy you are joining us to celebrate the birth of Jesus!

After Mass everyone will continue on to family celebrations, honoring traditions or perhaps creating new traditions. As a little girl, one



of my favorite Christmas Day traditions was on the 30-minute ride home after a long day of opening gifts, attending Mass, going to my maternal grandparent's home for Christmas luncheon then on to my paternal grandparent's home for Christmas dinner. My family of 7 would sing the song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas", trying to remember all of the strange gifts given to "my true love". I'm not sure if any of us realized the significant meaning behind this song.

Catholics in England during the period of 1558 – 1829, were prohibited from ANY practice of their faith-public or private. It was a CRIME to be a Catholic!

The Twelve Days of Christmas was written in England as one of the "catechism songs" to help young Catholics learn about their faith. This was a memory aid-and could not be in writing-because if caught, you would be imprisoned or worse!

The song gifts are hidden meanings to the teaching of the faith. The "true love" refers to God Himself. The "me" who receives the presents refers to every baptized person. The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ.

The meaning of the other gifts:

- 2 Turtle Doves The Old and New Testaments
- 3 French Hens Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity
- 4 Calling Birds The Four Gospels
- 5 Golden Rings The first 5 books of the Old Testament, the Pentateuch -which gives the history of man's fall from grace
- 6 Geese a-laying The 6 days of creation
- 7 Swans a-swimming The 7 sacraments & 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit
- 8 Maids a-milking The 8 Beatitudes
- 9 Ladies Dancing The 9 fruits of the Holy Spirit
- 10 Lords a-leaping The 10 Commandments
- 11 Pipers Piping The 11 faithful apostles
- 12 Drummers drumming The 12 points of doctrine in the Apostles Creed

In a small faith sharing group, bonds are formed over time, blessings and burdens are shared, friendships are made, faith is deepened and the relationship with our Lord is strengthened. It's most definitely learning that I need, and the purposeful pause each Monday night to center myself and focus on the content with such an amazing group is helpful beyond measure." Preparing for Easter

First Eucharist: Parent and child preparation required. Contact Amy Golden


Reconciliation: 2nd & 4th Saturday at 10:00am or by appointment.

Marriage: Arrangements should be made six months in advance. One of the parties must be a registered parish member and a practicing Catholic.


St. Bruno Book Club


