

Showing Up

I broke my foot once, when my second child was only 12 weeks old, and I was about to move houses. For six weeks I was confined to a chair, a shrieking newborn in my arms, a toddler running circles around me, and my right foot rendered useless by a plaster cast. I couldn't do anything without assistance. I couldn't eat or get a drink or change my clothes or feed my children.

My family was in dire straits. A lot of people offered help, but there

was a core group of friends and family members who really saved us.

These are the people who turned up in my driveway with empty vans and cooked meals. These are the people who blocked off their Saturdays to haul furniture, mow our lawn, and run after unruly kids. These are the people who said: "Here I am. Give me a job."

If you've ever really, really needed another person's help, you know that "showing up" means more than saying: "Let me know what you need." It means saying: "I'm already here. Tell me what to do."

So often, I pay lip service to the idea of submission. "What do you want, God?" I ask, and I secretly hope that what He wants isn't one of those things that I'm not willing to give.

What if I really strove to "show up" for God? What if I was ready to give what He asks of me, whatever it is?



Adult Formation

"The crowds listened to the inspiring words of John the Baptist and were motivated to change their lives, leaving their lives of sin. After repenting of their transgressions they let John immerse them in water so that they could die to their past and go forth born anew. The washing of water symbolized the washing of their sins away...an exterior sign of an interior conversion. Some biblical scholars and historians believe John may have been influenced by the Jewish sect known as the Essenes. Among their traditions was a baptism of repentance. On the other hand, ritual bathing was a common practice in the Old Testament, stemming from the need to cleanse oneself from things that made a person 'unclean.' In the end, John was adapting various customs of ritual bathing and 'preparing a way for the Lord,' helping people open their hearts to the Messiah who would come to baptize not only through water, but with the Holy Spirit." (Source: Philip Kosloski, Aleteia.org) John the Baptist led others to the faith. Who has been an influence in your life of faith? Let them know the impact they have made on your life.

The beginning of your connection to the Trinity was your baptism in water and the Holy Spirit. When (besides the reception of the Sacraments) have you felt that connection - what are some God moments in your life? Be sure to share those pages of the story of your life with others! Those events are part of your history and *HIS-story*. How are you using the gifts of the Holy Spirit to be the light of Christ in the world?

What might you need to cleanse yourself from in order to shine the light of Christ more brightly?

Catholic Social Teaching

#4 OPTION FOR THE POOR AND VULNERABLE

This fourth Catholic Social Teaching is a call to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable <u>first</u>, before the desires of the rich. Our incarnational instruction from Jesus himself says "what you did for the least of these, you did it for me. (Matt. 25:46) As Pope Francis tells us in Fratelli Tutti, "not to share our surplus money with the poor is to rob them and take away their livelihood. The 'riches' we possess are not our own, but theirs as well."

Practically speaking, the needs of the poor include the rights of workers over maximizing profits, the preservation of the environment over uncontrolled industrial expansion, and production for social needs over production for military purposes. By ensuring the rights of the working poor, we enable them to become active members of society and contribute for the good of us all. It is not hard to see that the poor are suffering disproportionately from climate change and global warming. And rather than seeing social programs as a handout, the Church reminds us that we all have a right to the earth's goods.

As the first letter of John states:

"How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's good and sees one in need and refuses to help." 1Jn 3:17-18




St. Bruno Book Club




