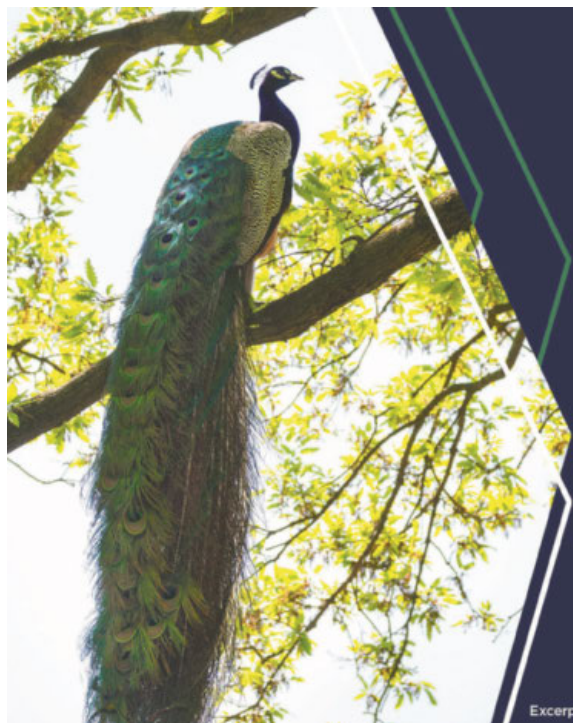

Weekly Message



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In my parents' bedroom there were on the wall two photos of my mom and dad from their early adulthoods. The photo of my mother entranced me when I was a boy. I loved looking at it, even though I saw her in daily life. Something about that picture captured her perfectly. It was an image of the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength that enveloped me from the start of my life. It was an icon of the woman who fed, taught, and encouraged me. I felt a deep pride that I came from such beauty.



The beatitudes of Jesus are a kind of self-portrait. But it is a strange picture. At first, the blessings of being poor, mourning, and hungering and thirsting for righteousness may seem bizarre or, worse, a religious delusion. Who wants to look like *that*? But if we look again, we begin to see the characteristics of Jesus' form. He becomes poor and fills it with his riches for us, he weeps and mourns for us, and fills it with his joy, he hungers and thirsts for us to be righteous, and so satisfies us. And so on. It's the way he appears on the cross.

Perhaps we should put on our bedroom room walls the words of the beatitudes next to a crucifix of the Lord Jesus. Then we can do what the beatitudes are designed for, to gaze at the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength of the one who is our origin, and who is with us every day. And little by little, we'll start to look like him.

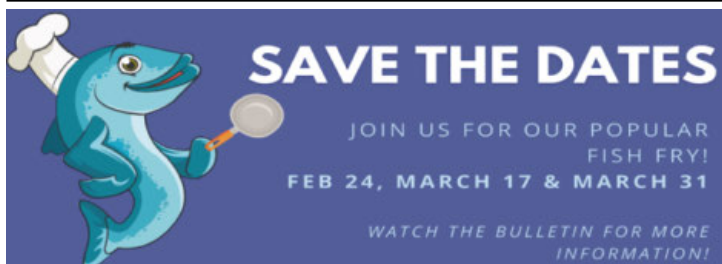

Building the Domestic Church Tip #16

Be authentic to your family's interests and personalities.

The point of building the Domestic Church isn't to impress someone else. It's to help your children and yourself remember to keep Jesus the focus of your day.

If you aren't a crafty family, don't do crafts. If your family doesn't like to sing, don't sing hymns at home. Do what is authentic to **your** family, not the family who sits in the pew next to you on Sunday morning.

Think about your family's interests and try to incorporate your faith around that. If your kids love to eat and or cook, make a special dinner to celebrate a saint's feast day or someone's baptismal anniversary. If you like to decorate your home with sentimental items, display crucifixes, religious pictures and saint statues in every room. (These could be items that have passed down to your family or that have been received as gifts). Maybe your children are very active, try praying a walking rosary.

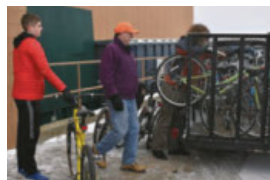


Middle & High School Faith Formation

Youth Ministry Team Spread Love and Cheer to Milwaukee's Homeless Community

On a very cold and windy Saturday in mid December, a group of teens from GO FISH!'s Confirmation Prep program generously donated their time to give back to the community.

They were tasked with picking up the amazing donation of 170 bicycles from the St. Vincent de Paul stores in Waukesha County and delivering them to the Sister MacCanon Brown



Homeless Sanctuary in downtown Milwaukee. The teens (along with their sponsors or parents) were not only able to do the leg-work of moving the bicycles, but they were also able to distribute them to the homeless community of Milwaukee.

The teens were truly humbled by the experience of distributing the bicycles and generous donation of mittens and hats from the parish as the number one takeaway of the experience was the overwhelming sense of gratitude that the recipients felt towards our teens and all of those who donated and helped make the day possible. One of our teens, Alison Skowronek, took on the role of reporter for the event and wrote an article about the experience:

"To start off our day we went to St. Vincent De Paul in Pewaukee, who generously provided the bikes to distribute, and we loaded them into trailers. While we were loading the bikes, I interviewed one of the volunteers who took time to share with me how she felt about being able to give back to her community. Natalie Miles, a junior from KM, shared; 'I love helping out in the community and being able to give back. Helping all these people makes me feel fulfilled and it's great being able to do it with my community members.'



"After having loaded all of the bikes onto the trailer, a group of us headed

to the Milwaukee area to the Sister MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary to distribute the bikes. Seeing the kids and adults being able to receive the bikes as gifts was certainly a good feeling of being able to give back this holiday season. What Sister Brown does is certainly amazing and her dedication to helping is more than admirable, and thanks to her and Deacon Joe, who started this tradition eight years ago, this area in Milwaukee is blessed to receive bikes every Christmas season. Giving back this Christmas was an amazing way to not only give to those who are less fortunate, but it reflects God's love through the coming together of the community and giving back what we can."

BLESSED ARE THEY

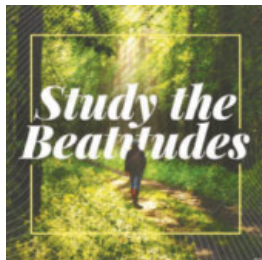

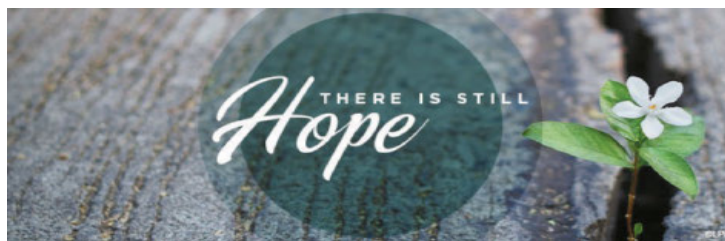

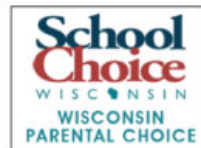
St. Bruno is a School Choice School

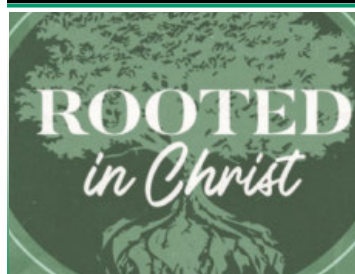
St. Bruno Book Club

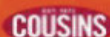
