

Weekly Message



As a kid I remember looking at my sister and thinking, "No man is ever going to marry her. She is way too...my sister!" I couldn't see her as anything except my goofy, emotional, cooties-laden sister. Years later, on her wedding day, I remember seeing how her husband looked at her, he was totally in love with her, his watery eyes full of overwhelmed joy, drinking in her beauty and grace. He was the one who actually saw her. Blinded by



familiarity, I had not been able to see her until now. She was glorious. I finally saw how beautiful my sister really was.

Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shone like the sun and his clothes dazzle with heavenly light. If it's a miracle, it is so related to the apostles' perception of the glory of Jesus. The physical spectacle reveals how the Father perceives the Son, so to speak: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to him." The Son is always bathed in the Father's love. It's only just now that they finally perceive it.

Who could possibly give his or her heart totally to Jesus? If we perceive him to be just another teacher, symbol, or moral example, we can't. But if the Holy Spirit gives us eyes to see that he is the Beloved Son of God, who makes our humanity not just pleasing to God but filled with glory ... then who can resist him? Perhaps only the lovers are the ones who properly see. — Father John Muir ©LPi

Child & Family Ministry

Building The Domestic Church—Lenten Series

This idea is shared by Erin Eilskov, third grade catechist in our Sunday Faith Formation program. She created these bags for her students to share with their families at home.

Items needed: purple cloth or napkin, plate, sand, 2 hearts, pipe cleaner, 6 stones

- Find somewhere to be your Lent place.
- Spread out the purple napkin. *Purple is the color of Lent*.
- Place the plate on the napkin
- Pour the sand into the plate. The sand reminds you that Jesus went into the desert.
- Put the 2 hearts in the sand. The hearts remind us of God's love.
- Make the pipe cleaner into a cross and place it on the plate. The cross reminds us that Lent is the time we remember that Jesus journeyed to the cross.
- There are 6 stones in your bag. There are 6 Sundays in Lent. Each Sunday, add a stone to your mini-desert.

Your Lent place will help remind you to follow Jesus, to talk to him, and to do the things he wants you to do. Thank you to Erin, for helping to build the Domestic Church!



Catechism In A Year

Engaging in THE CATECHISM IN A YEAR is a long journey. It can get really tough to persevere through it when life gets busy, the language is difficult to understand, or you miss a couple of days. Here's some insight from Fr. Mark Toups (<u>Ascension Lenten Companion</u>) about being intentional with our spiritual growth.

"Rarely do we grow unless we are intentional about our growth. Intentionality primarily requires three things: we have to know what we want, we have to have a plan, and we have to have people hold us accountable. I ask you:

What do you want God to do in your life? When are you going to carve out time for prayer? Who is going to hold you accountable? This journey could be life-changing, but it will not just happen; you must be intentional.

Second, intentionality requires that we have the courage to ask ourselves what may be preventing our spiritual growth. In other words, if we are going to carve out time for prayer, we may have to let go of using our time for other things.

Third, **intentionality requires depth**. If we are going to ask people to hold us accountable, then we have to have the courage to have a conversation with them at a very particular depth. This may require a bit more vulnerability as we share why we are asking them to hold us accountable. This will also mean that the conversation shifts to a deeper level, from the more superficial things of life to the more substantial things." 




