Weekly Message



When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.



Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. *Of course* we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear.

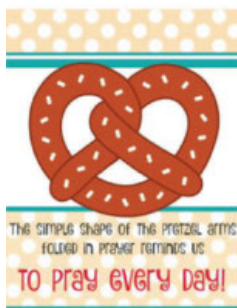

Pretzels for God: Lent and the Pretzel

Did you know that the pretzel is a food associated with the season of Lent? The story is that a young monk who lived during the early 600's was baking unleavened bread, which is a Lenten fasting food. The monk fashioned the leftover dough into the pretzel shape we recognize to imitate the prayer posture of arms crossed over the chest, each hand touching the opposite shoulder. Some believe this was to remind the monks to pray during Lent. Other stories say that the monk used his creation as a reward for the children who could recite their prayers. They called the breads "little arms" *bracellae*, (Latin), the German word "pretzel", which we know as "pretzel."



Thus, the pretzel is the most appropriate food symbol in Lent. It still shows the form of arms crossed in prayer, reminding us that Lent is a time of prayer. It consists only of water and flour to remind us that Lent is a time of fasting. Source: Catholicculture.org
Next time you go to the store, you'll find pretzels in a variety of shapes; sticks, rods, bites, circles, etc. But when you see the classic twist, remember to say your prayers.

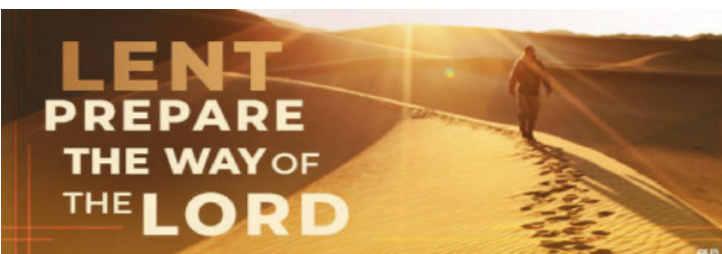

When our neighbor started a 29 day course of radiation for cancer treatment, my grandchildren and I created a paper chain with 29 links. At first they did not want to finish the chain, so I had to encourage the boys. We talked about making our neighbor happy and how he and his wife would love to visit with them because they didn't have any grandchildren - both he and his wife were so happy to see the little ones. We discussed with him how to tear a link off each day when he got home after treatment and he smiled so big remembering what a paper chain was. He appreciated the gesture and did actually look forward to making that chain shorter each day. *A Holy Moment is a grace-filled, prayer-directed action. (Holy Moments, p 40)* Pray about how you can collaborate with God to create Holy Moments in your life. Solidarity

In the traditional list of Catholic virtues, **solidarity** is not listed. We need to turn to the Catholic Social Teachings to find it as a required Catholic behavior showing high moral standards. We don't see this word often. Solidarity is defined as unity among individuals or mutual support within a group. That is, we are one human family, despite individual differences.

This concept is not easy for us as Americans who have a history of "rugged individualism". We are challenged by the idea of a group mentality. We are more prone to examine our individual consciences than our community conscience. We often fail to see that we are our brothers and sisters keepers. If we flourish as individuals, we flourish as a society. "If one member suffers, all suffer. If one member is honored, all rejoice." (1Cor 12:23, 26)

Much is written today about just systems. It is very difficult for individuals to be just when the system they are expected to live in is unjust. What if we had systems --social, political, cultural, economic, and environmental-- that oriented us to truly live in harmony, peace, community, and unity? Then the virtue of solidarity, caring about the welfare of each individual in the world, would fall into place. Developing just systems to promote this is, Biblically speaking, our God-given mandate.

In this age of so much division, our call is to cultivate a shared passion for commitment to the common good, a commitment to a community of belonging and solidarity "worthy of our time, energy and resources." It is a call that is both simple and extremely challenging.

St. Bruno Book Club

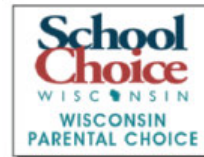
