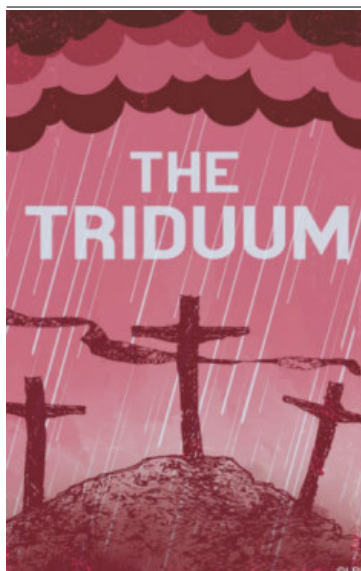

Weekly Message



What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine you're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, "**The master has need of it**," they let them take it. Of course, Jesus *knew* they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins, Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says, "**The master has need of it**." And simply let it go. You'll be amazed what the master will do with it. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

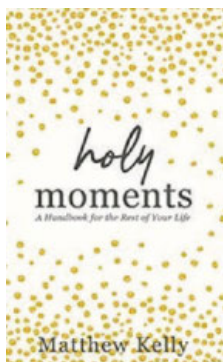

Building The Domestic Church—Lenten Series

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday, which commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem to celebrate Passover before his death. Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem is found in all 4 Gospels: **Matthew 21:1–11, Mark 11:1–11, Luke 19:28–44, and John 12:12–19.** Jesus descends from the Mount of Olives towards Jerusalem, and the crowds lay their clothes on the ground to welcome him as he triumphantly enters Jerusalem. Red is the liturgical color of Palm Sunday, and traditionally many people wear red when they attend this Mass on Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. The summit of the Liturgical Year is the **Easter Triduum**—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday.

SEDER MEAL

Members of a weekly small faith sharing group participated in a **Seder Meal** alongside the eldest students of St Bruno School. Traditional foods were sampled: bitter herbs (horseradish) representing the bitterness of slavery, greens to represent spring dipped in salt water to signify the tears of the Israelites in bond-



age, wine (aka grape juice), unleavened bread as a reminder of the bread the Israelites took with them when they fled Egypt, charoset - an applesauce like mixture to represent the mortar that the Israelites used as slaves, lamb to remind of the Paschal lamb, and matzo soup. As the ritual progressed, the prayers and story taking us from the bitterness of slavery to the hope and struggle for freedom were shared as different foods were eaten. ~ Mary Kral: Director of Adult Formation and Human Concerns

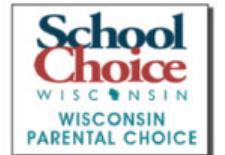

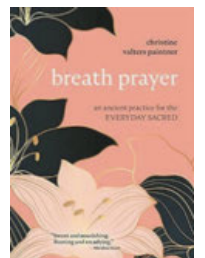
