



The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. Scary indeed.

Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. A better view is this: to Jesus, your life matters. The universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. It is a theater of love offered and either accepted or rejected. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. It really does.

This should not only be sobering but exhilarating. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that he is inviting us, therefore our lives matter a great deal. There is a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. Explaining The Eucharistic Revival to your Child

To revive something is to make something alive again.

In combining the two words, Eucharist and revival, the Eucharistic Revival hopes to encourage all people, especially us Catholics, to think about the Eucharist more and more. The Revival wants to help boost people's faith in the Eucha-



rist, Jesus' True Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, like when we, as young children, needed a boost from a parent to reach a water fountain when we were thirsty. The Revival wants to help make our faith alive and strong. The hope is that all people will start to take more interest in Jesus in the Eucharist and that the Eucharist becomes an important part of people's everyday life. The goal is that the Eucharist becomes something that we cannot live without. The hope is that over these three years that the Eucharist, Jesus, becomes wildly and endlessly popular! Lead a discussion with your child to help make connections to their passions and how they use their free time. It could look something like the

Have you thought about the Eucharist today?

What about yesterday? Did you think about Jesus in the Eucharist yesterday?

Do you think about the Eucharist every day?

Now I want you to think about your favorite hobby or pastime. Something you are crazy about. Something you love. What is popular to you? What happens when something is popular or is our favorite?

We think about it and talk about it A LOT! We talk to our friends about it. We talk to our brothers and sisters about it. We talk to our parents about it. We can't wait to see it, play with it or play it!

When we have free time, we use it or watch it or think about it. You might even want to put it in your backpack to bring to school. You might even draw pictures about it.

This is what we want for Jesus, the Eucharist! To be crazy about Him! To love Him! To think about Him all the time! To talk to others about the Eucharist often! To bring Him with us everywhere we go! We want Jesus in the Eucharist to be our most favorite thing in all the world! Source: Catholic Link


