Sometimes God is not fair... and for that we give thanks!

Have you ever thought about what we have in common that brings us together every Sunday? The obvious answer is, of course, our faith in God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and our need to offer God the praise and worship due to him. However, an equally true but far less flattering answer to what we share in common is... our sinfulness and our utter unworthiness; our weak humanity and mortality along with the simple fact that left to our own devices and on our own, we inevitably end up making a huge mess of things! So, we not only have God in common, but our NEED of God in common!
