### HIS WORD TODAY

"Since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help."

We might think of a high priest as portrayed in an epic biblical movie, or recall the role of the father of John the Baptist. What a different image the letter to the Hebrews presents, revealing Jesus in this sacrificial role, identifying totally with humankind, like us in 'all things but sin.'

We should find comfort in this passage, as He is described as one who sympathizes with our weakness, not condemning but understanding. The author encourages us, directing the way we address the Christ with total confidence. If we do so, we find two great gifts, mercy, which Pope Francis tells us is God's greatest gift to us, and the timely help we need to do and be better.

A question: How do I approach Jesus at this moment? With confidence, seeking mercy, finding strength in His help?

### READINGS

#### First Reading: Isaiah 53:10-11

Isaiah speaks of how the Servant of God will have to give his life up for the sins of other people. Because of this suffering the Servant will receive eternal life for himself and all the people whose sins are forgiven because of him.

#### Second Reading: Hebrews 4:14-16

Jesus is considered to be the new high priest and mediator between God and his people. Fortunately, Jesus has experienced the same temptations as other people, and so he has more tolerance of our weaknesses.

#### Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

Two of the disciples ask Jesus that they be allowed to sit at his right and left side when he comes into his glory. Jesus explains that they should not be concerned with their position. Instead they should concern themselves with serving others just as Jesus was planning to serve many in giving his own life for their sins.

### SU PALABRA HOY

“Y ya que tenemos en Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, un Sumo Sacerdote insigne que penetró en el cielo, permanezcamos firmes en la confesión de nuestra fe. Porque no tenemos un Sumo Sacerdote incapaz de compadecerse de nuestras debilidades; al contrario él fue sometido a las mismas pruebas que nosotros, a excepción del pecado. Vayamos, entonces, confiadamente al trono de la gracia, a fin de obtener misericordia y alcanzar la gracia de un auxilio oportuno.”

Pudiéramos pensar de un sumo sacerdote como se representa en una película bíblica épica, o recordar el papel del padre de San Juan Bautista. La carta a los Hebreos presenta una imagen muy diferente, revelando a Jesús en su papel de sacrificio, identificándolo totalmente con la humanidad, igual a nosotros en todo, ‘a excepción del pecado.’

Deberíamos encontrar consuelo en este pasaje, ya que se le describe como uno que comprende nuestras debilidades, sin condenarnos, sino que nos comprende. El autor nos alienta, dirigiéndonos al camino que lleva a Cristo con toda confianza. Si lo hacemos así, alcanzamos dos grandes dones: la misericordia, que el Papa Francisco nos indica que es el mayor don que Dios nos ha dado, y la ayuda oportuna para hacer el bien y ser mejores.

Una pregunta: ¿Cómo me acerco a Jesús en este momento? ¿Con confianza, buscando su misericordia, encontrando fuerza con su ayuda?

### LECTURA

#### Primera Lectura: Isaías 53:10-11

Isaías habla de cómo el Siervo de Dios tendrá que ofrecer su vida por los pecados de otros. Debido a su sufrimiento el Siervo recibirá vida eterna para El y toda la gente cuyos pecados han sido perdonas por El.

#### Segunda Lectura: Hebreos 4:14-16

Se considera a Jesús el nuevo gran sacerdote y mediador entre Dios y su pueblo. Afortunadamente, Jesús ha experimentado las mismas tentaciones que otra gente, y por ello tiene más tolerancia a nuestras debilidades.

#### Evangelio: San Marcos 10:35-45

Dos de los discípulos piden a Jesús que les permita sentarse uno a su derecha y el otro a su izquierda cuando lleguen a su gloria. Jesús explica que no deben preocuparse de la posición. En vez deberían preocuparse en servir el uno al otro como Jesús planeaba servir a muchos al ofrecer su propia vida por los pecados de la gente.
