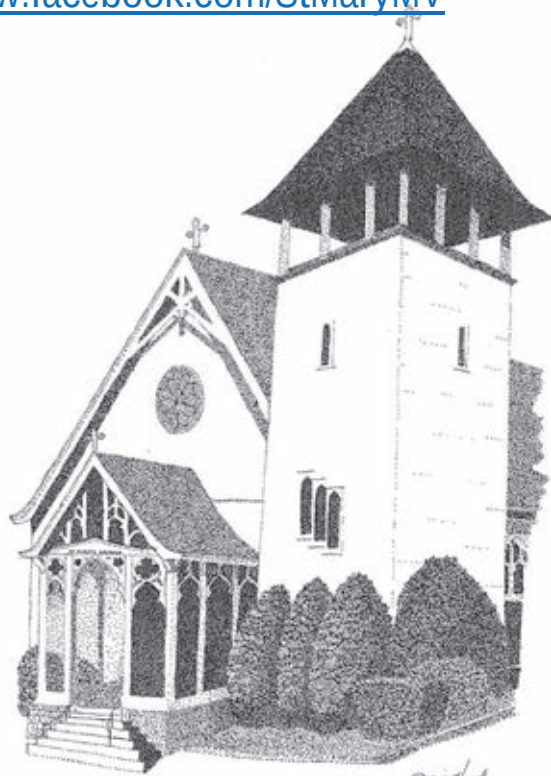

In baptism, we are given the name of Christ. In Christ, we come to realize who we are and whose we are: sons and daughters of God. In baptism, we take on the work and responsibility of the name of Christ we receive: to live for others rather than ourselves, to seek the will of God in all things. But this baptism is not just a naming ceremony- it is the beginning of a commitment that continues every day of our journey to the dwelling place of God.

The Christmas season officially comes to an end today at the banks of the Jordan River with Jesus baptism by John. But the Messiah remains. Jesus is no longer the child in a Bethlehem Manger but the adult redeemer making his way to Jerusalem. The good news spoken by the angels continue to unfold; the most wondrous part of the Christ story is yet to be revealed. As God expresses his pleasure in his Beloved son at Jesus baptism in today's Gospel, God speaks his name joy and love in our own simple and ordinary attempts to imitate Jesus compassion, justice and reconciliation. May the Spirit we received at our own baptisms continue to move us

to do the work of Jesus gospel, to “tear open the heavens” and give voice to the love of God in our homes and schools and communities and churches.

Pero este bautismo no es sólo una ceremonia de nomenclatura, es el comienzo de un compromiso que continúa todos los días de nuestro viaje a la morada de Dios.

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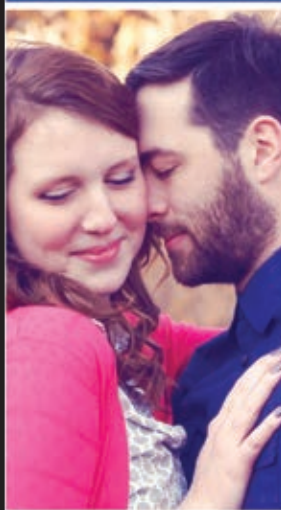
