As is normal for Vince & Theresa, they received the First Friday Sacraments of Reconciliation & Anointing of the Sick by their Assistant Pastor, Fr. Bedient, on 11/5. Later that afternoon, Fr. Leo offered Mass for them in their home. After Mom's decline on Saturday morning, Fr. Leo anointed Mom again & gave her the Apostolic Pardon & Holy Communion. Susan prayed the Rosary & several Chaplets at her bedside on Saturday afternoon & evening.
