Today in Children's Liturgy of the Word we asked the question: What does it mean to see with the eyes of faith? In today's Gospel, the disciples of Jesus having gone to the tomb and seeing it empty are now gathered together in an upper room. Even though the door was locked, Jesus appeared to them and spoke to them. Thomas was not with the other disciples when Jesus appeared to them. When Thomas was told by the other disciples that Jesus had appeared to them, he did not believe them. Jesus came back and appeared to the disciples a second time. This time Thomas was with them. Now Thomas could really see Jesus with his eyes and hear Him with his ears, just as the other disciples had. But Jesus let Thomas do something more. Jesus knew that Thomas doubted, so He invited him to touch His wounds. Jesus said, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." John 20:27 Thomas no longer doubted. He now knew it was Jesus. Thomas called Jesus, "My Lord and my God!" Thomas now believed and had faith. Thomas and the disciples were given a very special favor by God because they were able to see, hear, and touch the Risen Lord. But Jesus said that those of us who haven't seen or heard or touched Him are really blessed. Why? It is because we don't see Jesus with our eyes. Instead we see Jesus with the eyes of faith.

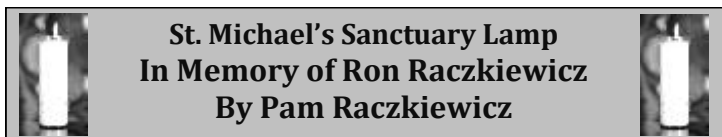
