#### Fr. Mike's Musings

So, where does the Church get its authority to impart God's forgiveness on penitents? As with all of the sacraments this authority comes from Jesus Christ. He offered forgiveness throughout the course of His ministry while teaching and reminding those around Him of the g never-ending limits of God's mercy. Then, to stress the importance of mercy and forgiveness, He made the



supreme sacrifice of love by giving up His life for the sake of humanity. "But God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us."

(Romans 5:8)

With this statement put before us in Scripture it would be surprising if Jesus had not given the Church the authority to forgive sins.

Immediately following the Resurrection, Jesus appears to the Apostles and bestows on them the power to forgive sins. This is the first gift that the risen Christ has entrusted to His nascent Church.

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

(John 20:22-23)

These words showed the first Christians that Jesus had given them the authority to forgive sins in His name. They shared this forgiveness in the practice of the other sacraments, primarily those of Baptism, the Eucharist, and the Anointing of the Sick. This proves to be of the utmost importance as it is by forgiving the transgressions of others, we ourselves are forgiven through that same pardon of the Father bestowed by Jesus. Remember the words of 'The Lord's Prayer'?

The Sacrament of Reconciliation has gone through a number of revisions in how it is implemented among the faithful. The chief problem concerned what sins were forgivable and what were not. Jesus never specified, so early Church leaders began to develop certain codices and guidelines to try and clarify the meaning and use of the sacrament. Some heretical splinter groups held that mortal sins were beyond even the forgiveness of God, fortunately this idea was condemned at the Council of Nicea (325). In the statement condemning the heretical views the Church taught that there was no sin that transcended the power of God, and therefore fell under the authority granted to the Apostles by Christ. The only way that any sin would not be forgiven is if the offender had not truly repented of those sins. This still holds true today.

As time progressed the theology of reconciliation began to be shaped into how it is understood and implemented. The basic structure of the sacrament evolved to a system that is familiar in the current practice of the Church. First, there must be true contrition (sorrow and willingness to change); then the offense must be confessed to a priest; the performance of a penitential act assigned by the priest must be accomplished; once this is completed the absolution for the offense is granted by the priest. These four basic elements were codified in the documents of the Council of Trent (1551) in order to provide a set defense against Protestant reformers who were publicly questioning the reasons for and validity of the sacraments of the Catholic Church. This became the template and mode of operation for Catholic penitents for the next three hundred years.

Change is inevitable, it is a part of our earthly existence. Change will come to the structure and idea of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. But as we will see it is a change that will only serve to strengthen and enhance our perception of the extent of God's mercy among us.

### REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

#### Fifth Week of Easter

**Pray daily:** Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, you have revealed to the nations your saving power and filled all ages with the words of a new song. Give us voice to sing your praise throughout this season of joy. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Monday: John 14:21-26. Jesus said, "[T]hose who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them." Do you believe that Jesus will draw you into intimacy with himself in knowledge and love if you invite him? Have you invited him?

**Tuesday:** John 14:27-31. Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." Do you experience his peace? Do you believe in his words? Do you read them?

**Wednesday:** John 15:1-8. "I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit...." How do you "abide in Christ"? How would you affect others if you were always consciously aware of Christ's presence in you?

**Thursday:** John 15:9-11. "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love." How often do you deliberately recall and believe in God's love for you?

**Friday:** John 15:12-17. "I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father." Do you believe Jesus delights in sharing his heart—his thoughts, feelings, desires and dreams—with you? Do you want to share yourself with those you love? Does Jesus feel the same way?

Saturday: John 15:18-21. "If you belonged to the world, the world would love you as its own. Because you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world—therefore the world hates you." Jesus is the stone rejected by the world's builders but approved by God. Do you tend to forget about him because our culture ignores him? When you base your choices on him, do you experience intimacy with God?

**As Christian:** Plan how you can make Jesus the cornerstone of your life. What are your key goals or motives at work? At home? In your social life? How can Jesus transform them?

As Disciple: Ask what you can do to become "full of the Spirit and wisdom." What books could help you in this? Are there Scripture study groups you could join? Adult religious education talks you could attend?

**As Prophet:** Each morning choose one particular area of your life—home, work, recreation, civic life—where you can proclaim the glorious works of Christ. Choose an action which will speak without need of words.

As Priest: Consciously offer yourself with the bread and wine at the Offertory of the Mass, and again with Christ when his Body and Blood are lifted up at the Consecration. Be given, offered and lovingly sacrificed for the good of others at home, at work, at play.

**As King:** Ask how Jesus can work through your special gifts and situation to extend his reign in the world. Try to improve something in your environment.
