

"The Lord Be With You"

Before Jesus ascended into heaven he did two things: He sent his disciples to carry out his mission in the world: "Go... and make disciples of all nations..." (see Matthew 28: 19) and he promised to be with them and to work with them forever: "I am with you always, to the end of the age" (see Matthew 28:20).

What does Jesus mean when he says "I am with you"? An echo of this is one of the most frequent expressions in the Mass: "The Lord be with you!" It is the same expression as our English departure-prayer, good-bye, which is an abridgment of "God be with you." This wish became such a standard Christian expression that we have stopped paying attention to what it means. Even when we do think what we are saying, we may not be conscious of the depth and mystery we as Church express when we use those words.

"The Lord be with you" is both a prayer and a reminder. It reminds us that by grace the Lord is with us. But he doesn't just watch over us and hover above us to be our

guide and help. The Lord is not with us just as a companion, the way human beings often are with each other. The Lord is with us within us! He is with us as only he can be: sharing his life with us, sharing our actions with us, speaking and smiling and touching and working through us, with us and in us.

To be with God is to be dedicated to Christ's mission.

The most solemn and significant response we make during the whole Mass is the Great Amen that concludes the Eucharistic Prayer. In this Amen we own—express union of heart with—everything the ordained priest has said during the Eucharistic Prayer. And the words which invite this Amen are always the same: "Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, forever and ever."

This is what "The Lord be with you" means. It is the recall of what each one of us as a Christian has recog-

nized and celebrated during the Mass: that in everything we do we are acting "through him, with him, and in him" because we are one with him and he is acting through us, with us and in us at every moment of our lives. 'The Lord be with you!" sums up the Mass. To say it to each other is to say in one phrase everything we say to God and to one another in the Mass, because being with Christ as his Body on earth is the fruit of his passion and the commitment we make in response to it. This is the Christian life.

To be with him is to be dedicated to Christ's mission.

It is to accept Jesus' words to the Father, "As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world" (John 17: 18). And it is to accept this mission knowing that the world as Saint John uses the word is an environment alien to the gospel, even closed and at times hostile to it. To go

into the world is to go as the Lamb of God, expecting the sacrifice. It is to offer one's body as the bread is offered at Mass, to become the bread of life for others: blessed and broken and given for the life of the world.

We do this by offering the truth of Christ embodied in our lives. We offer proof of the Good News by maintaining the purity of our ideals within a culture where deadly poison and the demonic assail us daily (see Mark 16:17-18). Our resistance is the sign of Christ's presence.

This is scary. The prospect of his passion made Jesus

sweat blood beforehand. He even asked the Father to take this mission away from him. If we don't feel eager to confront the world of business and politics or even of family and social life with the differentness of lives lived in radical witness to the gospel, that does not mean we love less, any more than Jesus' feelings diminished his love. Love consists in choices, not feelings. And our strength comes from trust in our union with Christ, not from any confidence we feel in ourselves. That is why Jesus told his disciples not to begin their mission until they were "clothed with power from on high" by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Luke 24:49).

And it is why we keep saying to each other, "The Lord be with you!" It reminds us that the Lord is with us and within us to be our strength.

REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

Seventh Week of Easter

Pray daily: Father, help us keep in mind that Christ our Savior lives with you in glory and has promised to remain with us until the end of time. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen.

Monday: John 16:29-33. "I have said this to you, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you face persecution. But take courage; I have conquered the world!" In what ways do you know peace consciously from the fact that Jesus has conquered the world?

Tuesday: John 17:1-11. Jesus prayed about his disciples: "[T]hey have believed that you sent me...and I have been glorified in them." How does your faith glorify Jesus, make his victory visible?

Wednesday: John 17:11-19. "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world." How can you stay conscious that you have been consecrated to carry Jesus' word, his truth, into your world of work, family and social life?

Thursday: John 17:20-26. "The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we

are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one." How does your intimacy with Christ and your union with others reveal in you the glory that was in Jesus?

Friday: John 21:15-19. Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?... Tend my sheep." Which of Jesus' sheep are you tending? When and how? Are you aware that Jesus values your love for him?

Saturday: John 21:20-25. "But there are also many other things that Jesus did; if every one of them were written down, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written." Do you believe God has more to teach you beyond what you already know? Do you want to learn more?

LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: Glorify Jesus by selecting something specific to help you stay in touch with "eternal life": regular Reconciliation, a weekday Mass, a break with some sin.

As Disciple: Glorify Jesus by opening yourself in some way to knowing God more deeply; for example, make a retreat, read a spiritual book, meditate through the rosary.

As Prophet: Glorify Jesus by incorporating into your life style something to show that you do not "belong to this world." Identify and challenge racist or sexist language; defend someone who is criticized unfairly.

As Priest: Glorify Jesus by consciously uniting yourself to Jesus on the cross. Believe that by enduring "in him" some suffering that you cannot escape you are contributing to the redemption of the world.

As King: Glorify Jesus by trying to change something in your environment that does not reflect the ideals of Christ. When you wake up each morning, make the sign of the cross on your lips as a reminder that you are "consecrated in truth" to have a life-giving influence on everyone around you. Try respectfully and peacefully to improve something that needs improving; do not yield to fear that the "world will hate you" because of it.
