

Fr. Mike's Musings

More than once we have sat through the first reading on Pentecost Sunday enduring the struggles of the lector as they try to properly pronounce the various nationalities listed by St. Luke in this passage from the Acts of the Apostles. It always makes for an interesting reading of God's word. Luke is, of course, symbolically telling us that the whole world has gathered to hear the Good News of the coming of the Holy Spirit among them. If we were to make a similar list of nations in the 21st Century, would we know all of the nations and peoples of the world? How many countries on the continent of Africa can we name? What do we know of the lives of the peoples of those countries? Are we able to name all of the nations of North, Central, and South America?

It is of no great importance as the Holy Spirit has come for all people, in every corner of the world. The Spirit does not recognize nations or ethnicities but embraces everyone equally as children of God. Realizing this we should wonder about the potential for lasting peace if all of the world's leaders spoke with conviction about our common brotherhood with a spirit of divine truth, equal justice, and genuine love. We could then effectively make great advances in our efforts to eliminate war, violence, poverty, and ignorance.

The first greeting that Jesus extends to His disciple after the Resurrection is: "Peace be with you." (John 20:19) He is not just simply saying, "Hi, have a nice day." He is sharing the peace of God with them as well as commissioning them to carry that same peace into the world, to all peoples regardless of their nation or heritage. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." (John 20:21) This gives us much to ponder as we meditate on everlasting the presence of the Holy Spirit among us.

This year Pentecost coincides with our national observance of Memorial Day. Although Memorial Day is a secular celebration it still points to something that strikes a chord in all of us, uniting us in a common acknowledgement of what others have given us, regardless of ethnicity or heritage. We honor those who have paid the ultimate price, their lives, to protect and support those freedoms that we Americans hold dear. By their sacrifice for the good of all in our country they have earned our deepest and most heartfelt prayers and gratitude. "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 15:13)



The Dromise of Deace

Peace be with you! Peace is the fruit of Christ's Resurrection. "Peace" is his Easter greeting to the disciples. Peace is Paul's greeting in every letter. Peace is the message we announce to the world. And peace is the promise that Pentecost proclaims.

Peace is not simply the absence of conflict. There is not true peace in the home just because spouses are not actually fighting. There is not true peace in the city just because no riots have broken out. True peace between nations means more than not going to war. There is not true peace in schools or worksites just because no one is actively undermining someone else. Peace is unity of mind, heart and will. True peace is what Jesus came to establish on earth.

Christ's peace is a peace that nothing in this world can give. It is the fruit of the Holy Spirit's uniting all peoples of the world in truth and in love, in mutual understanding and acceptance, in a common commit-

ment to the good of all without exception, just as God is committed to the good of all. The peace of Christ is the peace we strive to establish in family and social life, in business and politics, between ourselves and others. It can only be established as Christ established it: through our dying and rising again. Promoting peace means dying to all that divides us from one another; answering selfishness with self-sacrificing

love; acknowledging and moving beyond past hurts through forgiveness; overcoming prejudice with openness; reconsidering our personal opinions through humility; facing our preferences and familiar customs with a willingness to change; breaking out of any ethnic exclusivity through a new vision of the human race.

MAY 28, 2023

PENTECOST SUNDAY

Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13; John 20:19-23

Following Jesus along the way of peace means that we must be willing to "tum our back on father and mother," renouncing any loyalty which obstructs our loyalty to God and to the whole human family. We are one people now—not "one nation under God" but one people, one family under a God who embraces all nations, all peoples, all cultures. We can accept no dividing lines; we have died to everything that divides us.

This peace is not just a gift; it is a process, something to work at, a goal to which we dedicate ourselves. To establish this peace, we have all been given the gift of ministry through the Holy Spirit poured out in our hearts. When Jesus says, "Peace be with you," that peace is the presence of the Spirit within us. The Spirit of Jesus is an active Spirit, an empowering, impelling Spirit who

overflows with gifts of ministry to make us not merely the beneficiaries of peace but its bearers to the world. We do not simply receive peace as a gift; we accept it as a mission.

There are different gifts but the same Spirit; different ministries that serve the same Lord, working to es-

tablish his Kingdom. There are different achievements, but they come from the same God working through us. Even in the diversity of our gifts and ministries, we are united through the one purpose, the one power, the one presence in us all.

The miracle of tongues at Pentecost reversed the Tower of Babel, where pride caused such conflicts that the false peace of separation became the only means of survival. Separation breeds mistrust; it distorts communication and destroys peace. Surrender to the Spirit restores communication by making us sharers in a common history "in Christ" and providing us with a common vision, purpose and language. It empowers us to unite the world in love, to proclaim peace with tongues of fire.

REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

Eighth Week of the Year

Pray daily: Lord, you overcame sin and death that we might be free. You have told us not to worry about anything on earth because our Father in heaven knows what we need. Teach us to trust in the Father and be free. Amen.

Monday: Mark 10:17-27. "Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." What do you fear most about poverty? What did Jesus say about this fear?

Tuesday: Mark 10:28-31. "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house...or children or fields, for my sake...who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age...and in the age to come eternal life." Do you believe this? How do you show it?

Wednesday: Mark 10:32-45. "...whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many." How important is recog-

nition or status for you? What in your life shows Jesus' attitude toward these?

Thursday: Mark 10:46-52. "Jesus said..., 'What do you want me to do for you?' The blind man said to him, 'My teacher, let me see again." Would this be your answer? In what ways are you blind?

Friday: Mark 11:11-26. "My house shall be called a house of prayer...But you have made it a den of robbers." What in your life keeps you from praying? What takes up your time? What can you do about it?

Saturday: Mark 11:27-33. Jesus said to them, "I will ask you one question; answer me, and I will tell you by what authority I do these things." If you really ask, "Who is Jesus Christ for me?" how might the answer change your priorities?

LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: List in descending order how much money you spend on shelter, insurance, education, the offertory collection at Mass, charity to others, food, drink, clothes, entertainment and other expenses.

As Disciple: Divide the expenses above into categories such as: "necessary or unavoidable," "bears witness to proper care for myself," "shows love for others," "irrelevant to the Kingdom of God."

As Prophet: Ask which expenses show explicit faith or hope in God. Which are explicit expressions of your love for God? (The emphasis here is on "explicit." All expenses should be this implicitly, at least.)

As Priest: Decide how much you can spend specifically on helping the poor or ministering to others in need.

As King: Explicitly, formally, prayerfully give all your possessions to God. Write out a deed! Then accept responsibility for managing them according to God's desires.
