





Fr. Mike's Musings

"You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." (Psalm 110:4) These words were understood by the early Church as being prophetic of the priesthood of Jesus Christ.

Melchizedek was a pagan king and priest who offered bread and wine in sacrifice to the one "God most High" in the presence of the patriarch Abraham. In return Abraham gave gifts and a promise of protection to Melchizedek and his people, thus acknowledging that the sacrifice was honorable and acceptable to the God of the earth. This practice, and the Last Supper of Christ, is clearly the template on which the current day Eucharistic celebration is modelled.

The Catholic Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, views the Eucharist as the divine transforming of ordinary bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood. It is the ordained function of priests of the Church to continue this sacrificial mission (priest) of Jesus as well as His missions of prophecy (prophet) and leadership (king) in the world.

In the priestly ministry ordained priests confect and celebrate the Sacraments and lead their parish communities in worship. The greatest privilege given a priest is to pray the words of Christ over the offered gifts of bread and wine: "This is my Body. This is my Blood." Priests are also responsible to baptize, confirm (when delegated by the Bishop), hear confessions, marry couples, anoint the sick and dying, and bury the dead. Priests have also taken a vow the pray the Divine Office/Liturgy of the Hours seven times over the course of each day. This prayer cycle not only continuously gives glory to God, but also beseeches His mercy for those in the world who cannot or will not pray for themselves and others.

The prophetic ministry is accomplished by preaching, teaching both young people and adults the doctrines and values of the faith, and by staying true to the faith in conversations or debates with the curious, the questioning, and non-believers. Priests are the responsible custodians and guardians of the truth and Sacraments of Christ and His Church.

Priests facilitate the kingly ministry of Christ by serving as administrators in an assigned parish(es). They work with councils and other organizations to keep the parish community functioning as effectively as possible. They also cooperate with other priests in nearby parishes and throughout the diocese to coordinate the work of the Church throughout the diocesan territories.

In all that ordained priests must be and do, they must always be mindful that they are following in the footsteps of Christ, the 'Good Shepherd'. They have the responsibility and the privilege of extending His compassion, kindness, and generosity to the world—Catholic and non-Catholic alike. Being human, priests can fail, just as married couples can fail to reflect their love to their families and to the world, and sometimes even to one another. At one time priests were placed on a pedestal as if their vocation raised them up into a sort of untouchable state of sanctity. It was not so then and it is not so now. Priests have the same weaknesses and foibles as other human beings and struggle with the same appetites and temptations. They depend upon the grace of Christ to guide them and carry them through from one day to the next. What is especially needed is the support, love, and prayers of their families, friends, and the faithful. The vocation of the priest is one of love, the only reward to be sought by a priest is to have that love shared with all because it is rooted in Christ, who is God, and "God is love". (I John 4:8)

Seeing and Saying Truth

esus tells us that recognition is the key to reward: recognition of prophets and disciples, recognition of his own presence in others, recognition of ourselves as his Body on earth, dedicated to living his divine life in our human flesh and fulfilling his divine mission in our human circumstances.

Saint Paul tells us that we were all baptized into Christ Jesus: baptized into his death, buried with him and raised up with him to live a new life as the members of his risen Body on earth. We are not just human; we are divine. We are expected to live our human lives on this earth on a Godlike level. Our ground-level activity should be a manifestation of the presence of God in us—as that of Jesus was.

The more we realize this, the more likely we are to live it. The more aware we are of the mystery of Christ's presence in us, the more likely we are to let that presence reveal itself in our words and actions. The more radically we believe that we are the Body of Christ, the

more we will act like the Body of Christ. Awareness prepares us to act.

This is why we use titles and show special signs of respect for others: It is to remind us of a reality that we might overlook. We use titles such as Mr. and Mrs., Dad and Mom, Darling and Dear, or even Ole Buddy. They are all to remind us of what another person is and means to us.

We need to recognize that some titles can be used just

for the sake of prestige, even to imply that some people are superior to others. These titles do not express a Christian attitude. Jesus said, "[W]hoever wishes to be first...must be slave of all" (Mark 10:44). A good rule of thumb for Church titles is to accept and use JULY 2, 2023

those which express relationship while rejecting those which simply bestow prestige. For Christians, true human superiority does not come from position or rank, or even from talents or accomplishments. There is only one way to become authentically a better human being, and that is to become more like Jesus Christ, who "came not to be served but to serve, and to give his

> to "lose their lives"-or the self-image based on prestige or success-in response to Jesus' teaching and example will "find their lives" and discover their true value and identity as children of God.

When Jesus said, "[C]all no one your father on earth, for you have one Fatherthe one in heaven" (Matthew 23:9), and gave the same teaching about rabbi and instructor, titles were not the focus of his concern. We still

call our fathers "Father" and our teachers "Professor" or "Doctor." What Jesus meant was that we should not see any earthly relationship as ultimate, as if we owed so much respect to our fathers and mothers that we should please them rather than God. He said, "Who-

There is only one way to

ever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." We should be on guard against being so impressed by the brilliance of human teachers that we put more faith in their opinions than in the teaching of God. (See Matthew 20:25-28; 23:6-12; Mark 9:35.)

Yet we constantly accept the attitudes and values of our culture, especially those approved by the people we respect, even when these attitudes and values contradict the gospel. There are Christians who would not call a priest "Father" for anything on earth, but they are so subservient to cultural prejudices that they do not accept people of other races or ethnic origins as brothers and sisters in God's family.

Christians readily take a military oath to kill others on command, putting blind trust in an officer's judgment about the morality of a particular mission or a president's judgment about the morality of going to war. People who think Jesus is just talking about titles here are focusing on the gnat and missing the camel (see Matthew 23:24)!

REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

Thirteenth Week of the Year

Pray daily: Lord, you call us to life in its fullness. You invite us to live in constant awareness of your love for us and your presence within us. You call us to find our value in being your body on earth, your coworkers. Don't let me be distracted by anything less than this. Amen.

Monday: Matthew 8:18-22. Jesus answered a wouldbe disciple, "Follow me, and let the dead bury their own dead." When it comes to following Jesus, how much concern do you have about the opinions of other people?

Tuesday: Matthew 8:23-27. Jesus said to his disciples, "Why are you afraid, you of little faith?" What, whom do you worry about? What does this say about your beliefs?

Wednesday: Matthew 8:28-34. "Then the whole town came out to meet Jesus; and when they saw him, they begged him to leave their neighborhood." When would you prefer not to have Jesus around? Not to think about him?

Thursday: Matthew 9:1-8. "For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Stand up and walk'?" Do you believe more in the power of medicines to heal your body than in the power of the Sacrament of Reconciliation to heal your soul? Which do you use more?

Friday: Matthew 9:9-13. The Pharisees saw this and said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" When you are with friends who are not especially religious, are you ashamed to have Jesus around? How can you make him noticeably present?

Saturday: Matthew 9:14-17. Jesus answered them, "The wedding guests cannot mourn as long as the bridegroom is with them, can they?" When you submit to sadness, worry, discouragement, in what sense is Jesus not with you? How can you let him be with you?

LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: Wear or put where you work some visible symbol that says who Jesus Christ is to you.

As Disciple: Set aside definite times each day, each year (for example, time for a retreat) to read, hear and reflect on the teaching of Jesus.

As Prophet: Ask yourself whose opinion blocks you most from living the gospel as you desire. Talk to that person frankly about your religious beliefs.

As Priest: Each day choose one person to minister to. It does not have to be obvious.

As King: Pretend you are a supervisor for the Kingdom of God. (You are!) Make a report to the Lord on what needs to be changed around you and how you will try to do it.
