



#### Fr. Mike's Musings

nurtured in a life to love and serve the Lord.—Fr.Mike

As an educator I am always open to increasing learning opportunities, whether for the young or the not-so-young. Below is a re-print of a presentation made after the Sunday morning Mass at St. Michael's in Coopersville. For my two-cents worth, the Pre-School program offered at St. Michael's is enlightening and enriching for all concerned. My day is made much brighter when I visit these youngsters knowing that they are being cared for, educated, and

"My name is Kelli Ferguson and I am a parishioner at St. Michael's and attended the school through the 6th grade. Some of you may know my son, the child that bounces on his way up to give his offering to father. Or the one who likes to hold the book for the 'Children's Liturgy of the Word' so high and proud. I have to say there are many contributing factors to his love of God and His word, and there are a few that I want to share with you today.

There is a little classroom you can find all the way at the other end of the school building. It is filled with prayers decorating the walls, little cubbies for snacks and drinks, a bookshelf with tons of books, and in the morning right before class starts you will find a wonderful teacher that greets each student and parent that are arriving to start their day. Mrs. Cindy Lindberg is not only an educator, she wears many coats here at St. Michael's, but to me her most important role is being a teacher. She has used her gifts and talents that God has placed in her to love, nurture, and impact the littles hearts and minds of each student that attends. I know, every teacher is amazing, but Cindy has set the bar very high for future teachers. The handmade crafts that my son brings home hang proudly on our refrigerator and one in particular is a 'Jesus Loves Me and I Love Jesus' cross. I know it is cute hanging among our refrigerator door clutter, yet when he walks by and says, "Ha! Jesus LOVES me and I LOVE Jesus! Did you know that mom?" I can tell you that it not only warms my heart but gives me validation that St. Michael's pre-school was the best decision we made in beginning his education. Crafts are not the only thing that he brings home. I listen to his endless songs about Jesus that he sings in the car and around the house, and when it's time to pray before meals, he raises his hand and picks either the 'Hail Mary', 'Glory Be...', or the 'Our Father'. These are only a few of the priceless moments that set this little classroom apart. Not only is St. Michael's pre-school, amazing in more ways than one, it's SUPER affordable. Last year Cindy was able to get a grant and cut down tuition costs for each student. We also participate in 'Scrip' which is a program that is offered that gives us money back to use towards education just by purchasing gift cards to places we already shop. Here is a little secret, anyone can participate in this program and if you yourself don't have a child enrolled in preschool or faith formation you can choose a family to pass your savings on to.

So, I will end with this little thought. Do you know a little 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  - 5-year-old child that would thrive in a classroom filled with faith, love, and learning? If you are a great grand-parent, grandparent, parent, aunt, or uncle please reach out to Cindy Lindberg for fall enrollment and let's fill her classroom with tiny hands and big hearts and show them the love and support of the St. Michael's family."



**Mini Raffle:** You may bring donated items into the office during regular hours. If you would like to donate money for the committee to purchase items, please do so by August 20.



# Great Sorrow. Unceasing Anguish

aint Paul felt "great sorrow and unceasing anguish" because his fellow Jews had not as a people accepted Christ as Messiah. Elijah wanted to die because God's enemies controlled Israel. Jesus left his disciples feeling alone and powerless in a small boat battered by waves and wind. Why?

On the wall in a Nazi concentration camp an unknown prisoner wrote:

I believe in the sun, even when it isn't shining. I believe in love, even when there's no one there. And I believe in God, even when he is silent.

Elijah had just triumphed over all the false prophets of Baal, calling down fire from heaven. After that God sent wind and rain, ending the drought in Israel. But in spite of these signs and wonders, his enemy Jezebel retained her power and was threatening Elijah's life. That is when discouragement hit him. He complained to God, "I've had enough; take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors."

God's answer was to reveal himself to Elijah, not in the power of the wind "splitting mountains and break-

ing rocks," or of the earthquake or the fire, but in a "tiny whispering sound;" or, as it is also translated, in "a sound of sheer silence" stone silence.

Scholars compare this event with God's giving Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai, shaking the mountain and wrapping it in fire and

smoke. But, in spite of this, the people lost faith and worshiped the golden calf. After that God showed his innermost self to Moses, his true divine glory, which could only be translated into words as "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadAUGUST 13, 2023

fast love and faithfulness" (Exodus 34:6).

John's Gospel picks up this description of God and declares Jesus Christ the embodiment of it; "The law was indeed given through Moses; grace and truth [one translation says "enduring love"] came through Jesus Christ" (1:17). Jesus was the ultimate, the most perfect revelation of God's true personality, of his glory, on earth. Jesus revealed that glory most fully in the hour of his crucifixion and resurrection, the hour of his greatest vulnerability and love (see John 17:1).

At Jesus' death there were also signs of power: "At

that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook, and the rocks were split. Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and said. 'Truly this man was God's

Son!" (see Matthew 27:51-54). But the true revelation of God in Jesus was his acceptance of the Father's silence during the crucifixion and the gentleness, the "steadfast love" Jesus showed after his Resurrection, when he appeared to his disciples saying, "Peace be

God, in his deepest nature is love, not power; forgiveness, not retaliation with you" (Luke 24:36). Believers recognized that it was through powerlessness, vulnerability and love that God revealed in Jesus the full divine glory. God reveals himself to us, too, in the "stone silence" of his apparent absence from the world. When there are no external signs of God's power and the emotional comfort of interior consolations is gone, then we discover his most authentic, most reliable, most strengthening presence in our hearts. It is then that we experience the depth and the reality of purest faith, purest hope and purest love.

God, in his deepest nature is love, not power; forgiveness, not retaliation; a God who is patient to the point of appearing powerless, who appeals to freedom rather than using force. Jesus on the cross reveals him as he truly is.

# REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

#### Nineteenth Week of the Year

**Pray daily:** Father, we come, reborn in the Spirit, to celebrate our oneness with you in Jesus Christ. Touch our hearts; help them grow. Touch our lives; make them signs of your enduring love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Monday: Matthew 17:22-27. Jesus said, "The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and on the third day he will be raised.' And they were greatly distressed." Do you see it as defeat or victory when someone suffers injustice, oppression or violation and yet loves back?

**Tuesday:** Matthew 18:1-5, 10, 12-14. "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Are you willing to be as powerless and vulnerable as a child? What do children get through love that you cannot obtain through power?

Wednesday: Matthew 18:15-20. "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone." Have you ever done this? With what results? Why is this so risky to do?

**Thursday:** Matthew 18:21—19:1. Peter asked, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "Not seven times, but I tell you, seventy-seven times." How much will you take before getting violent in word or act?

**Friday:** Matthew 19:3-12. Some Pharisees tested him, saying, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any cause?" If they had asked instead about "killing for any cause," how do you think Jesus would have answered? Why?

**Saturday:** Matthew 19:13-15. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." What is special about children that makes them eligible for the Kingdom?

# LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

**As Christian:** Choose one thing you are trying to change by power; use Jesus' method of love instead.

**As Disciple:** Read one of the four Gospels completely. See if you can identify a value for which Jesus says we should be willing to kill.

**As Prophet:** Ask how you most frequently use violence against others (for example, in words) and decide how you can change that into a way that witnesses to God's "enduring love."

As Priest: Think of one thing which recurs in your life that you could accept as a way of offering yourself in union with the Lamb of God, a way of working against sin in the world by enduring evil with love. Offer yourself for this during Mass.

As King: Count the ways you or those you are associated with (at home, at work, as an American) try to force people by intimidation or threats to do what is right. Take one concrete step toward changing this so that you can work through persuasion (conversion) and respectful love instead.


