



#### Fr. Mike's Musings

Where has the time gone? 2023 is nearly complete, we have just finished celebrating the Feast of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls and now, having hardly time to catch our breath,

Thanksgiving is upon us and many have already begun their preparations for the Christmas season. But let us take things one step at a time and set our sights on Thanksgiving. There is no confusion in the name of

this holiday, it is clearly a time when we should count our blessings and give thanks for those blessings—to God and earthly benefactors.



Another point of thanks is on a more personal level for me and it has to do with the existence of an annual appeal that many believe to be unnecessary (some even consider it an act of thievery), this is the diocesan Catholic Services Appeal or CSA. This yearly collection by the diocese given by all the parishes of the Diocese of Grand Rapids is akin to the weekly collection taken up in parishes at the Sunday masses. The funds generated in both instances are the means by which operating expenses are covered and bills are paid. Without this revenue the lights, heat, and phones are turned -off, wages are unpaid and employees dismissed, and needed charitable services vanish leaving many to fend for themselves in a cold and hostile world. But let's get back to my own gratitude for the CSA campaign and the generosity of the diocesan faithful for making it a valuable resource, whether we like it or not.

In the early spring of 2009 I was in my third year of studies at Mundelein Seminary when an "interesting" malady befell me. I had developed a fairly large blood clot in my upper left arm (a very rare location) and watched as the lower part of the arm grew to three sizes larger than normal and had turned sickly blue-green in color. A diocesan brother, Michael Burt (now Fr. Burt at Our Lady of the Lake in Holland) rushed me to a medical center for treatment. After a week of hospitalization the clot was successfully treated and I was able to return to my studies. I later found out that the clot was on the verge of breaking free and that had I delayed getting treatment for another two hours I would have succumbed to a major stroke.

A week after returning from the hospital I received a billing notice stating that I owed nearly \$25,000.00 for my stay and treatment. My heart sank as I knew that I would have to cease my journey to the priesthood and take whatever work I could find to pay my debt. That evening as I sat at my desk contemplating the call that I was going to have to make to my parents the telephone rang and a deep, but concerned voice, greeted my halfhearted "Hello".

"Michael, I have heard that you are thinking about leaving the seminary program because of your hospital bill. Don't. We will cover it."

"Uh, thanks. Who is this?"


"Oh, It's Bishop Hurley. Don't leave the program the diocese insurance will cover you."  $\,$ 

"How, if I may ask?"

"A portion of the Catholic Services Appeal pays to insure clergy and seminarians. And you are one of us. The people take care of us very well."

I know that this sounds like a grade-B Hallmark script, but that is what happened. I was treated for a life-threatening condition and was able to continue my studies to become a priest for the Diocese of Grand Rapids because of the generosity of the people through their CSA contributions. For this I give thanks daily for my vocation and for my life. Both were given to me by the people I have vowed to sacramentally serve—God's people, the Church.

# Jesus on Responsibility

he whole point of this Gospel is that Jesus expects us to do something for the salvation of the world. What he expects of us is determined by the particular gifts and talents we have. In other words, we are "responsible"—that is, we will be required to "answer"—for the way we use what we have in order to help others know and serve God.

This may be shockingly new to us! Many of us are accustomed to think that all we are obliged to do as Christians is avoid sin and fulfill whatever other duties the Church has seen fit to make a rule about. For example, most Catholics would assume they are not obliged to go to Mass more than once a week since the law of the Church requires Mass only on Sunday. They would be shocked to hear that for some people, to go to Mass only on Sunday might be a serious failure in responsibility.

Suppose you were the only person in the world on close enough terms with the presidents of two hostile countries to be able to persuade one or both of them to pull back from the brink of war. Do you think you would have a responsibility—that you would be obliged in conscience—to make whatever sacrifice might be needed to prevent the war? And if you said, "I am too busy right now" or "I just don't have the money to spend on a trip like that," and war did break out, would not every soldier and civilian killed in the war have the right to rise up from the grave and say to you, "This is your fault. My blood is on your hands"? If you could have prevented the war—or even had a good chance of being able to prevent it—and did not try, would that not be a serious lack of responsibility?

Is it farfetched to say that we Catholics, who know God and who know that Jesus Christ is offering himself every day on the altar for the salvation of the world, have a serious responsibility to go to him and pray seriously for peace? If you are more than just a nominal Christian or a Catholic, if you are an active Catholic, a Christian blessed with a strong faith and instructed **NOVEMBER 19, 2023**

about what the Mass really is, do you not have a greater responsibility to pray for peace than someone who is lukewarm or spiritually ignorant? And if we Catholics, who *could* pray in union with Jesus in the Mass, do not pray, and do no prevent wars by prayer, does not every man and woman, every invalid, aged person and child who is going to be bombed and burned to death in war have the right to rise up from the grave and say to us Catholics, "My blood is on your hands. If you had filled the churches and prayed for peace, I would not have died!"?

The threat of war is only one example. We live in cities where lives are being ruined by drug abuse; where lives are destroyed by murders every year; where there are terrible pockets of poverty and thousands of people who suffer from the even greater poverty of not knowing God, who are "unchurched." We live in cities where there is still racial division, even without segregation; where there are old people not being visited, living in loneliness day after day. We live in a country in which thirty-seven percent of the girls and twenty percent of the boys now under eighteen either have been or will be sexually abused before their eighteenth birthday; a country in which two women a day die violently at the hands of their husbands. Since World War II our country has been militarily involved in more than one hundred countries; during that same time more than a quarter of a million people have died in wars. Does this not call for some kind of response—for some kind

of fervent, extreme response—from those who believe in God?

We all need to take stock of the gifts we have received from God: gifts of faith, gifts that can be used for Christian witness and ministry, the gift of knowing how to pray. And we need to ask what is required of us, what our responsibilities are in our times. If we take the gospel seriously, we have no choice about this.

#### REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

#### Thirty-Third Week of the Year

Pray daily: Lord, you have entrusted to me the treasure of your grace, your truth, your love for the world, your mission. Do not let me squander my life by letting my gifts go unused. Inspire me, act in me to bring about the peace and unity of your Kingdom on earth. Amen.

Monday: Luke 18:35-43. A blind man was sitting by the roadside near Jericho, begging. After they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by, he shouted, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" How are you crying out to Jesus? Are you helping others by it?

**Tuesday:** Luke 19:1-10. "[Zaccheus] was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature." What keeps you from seeing Jesus? What extraordinary things have you done to turn that obstacle into a blessing?

Wednesday: Luke 19:11-28. "I tell you, to all those who have, more will be given; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away." What gifts do you have to use in God's service? If you think you have none, how can you discover what they are?

**Thursday:** Luke 19:41-44. As Jesus drew near, he saw Jerusalem and wept over it, saying, "If you, even you, had only recognized on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes." Is Jesus weeping over you?

**Friday:** Luke 19:45-48. Jesus entered the Temple area and proceeded to drive out those who were selling things, saying, "It is written, 'My house shall be a house of prayer'; / but you have made it a den of robbers." What are you choosing to do that reveals your body as a house of prayer and temple of the Holy Spirit?

**Saturday:** Luke 20:27-40. "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed, they cannot die anymore..." What is important in a Christian marriage? What is unimportant? What difference does being married or not married make?

#### LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

**As Christian:** At Baptism you "offered your body as a living sacrifice to God." At the Offertory of the Mass, tell God again that wherever your body is, you will be sacrificed to doing God's will and work.

**As Disciple:** Read Romans 12:6-8 and 1 Corinthians 12:7-12. Write down what you perceive to be your gifts.

**As Prophet:** Pick out your greatest talent, what you most have to offer at work or for your family and friends. Ask how you can use that gift explicitly and consciously to promote the reign of God.

As Priest: Identify one gift God has given you and use it consciously to minister to someone each day this week.

**As King:** What is it that you and you alone can do for the reign of God because of your particular talents, your job, the special time and place where you are, the particular challenges you face or solutions you see? Assume your responsibility and act with faith, hope and love.


