

#### Fr Mike's Musings

For centuries the Jewish people have been awaiting a liberator, some leader from God who would fulfill their hopes and lead them back to a just and peaceful relationship with God and with one another. This anticipation was often a part of the religious and political language of the day. In the ancient world there was no concept of a separation of church and state. The people expected someone who would stand up against the Roman authorities and



their collaborators, someone who would openly and violently resist the occupiers of Judea and the outlying Jewish provinces. This awaited person was often referred to as "Messiah" (the deliverer) or "Christ" (the anointed one). The Jewish prophesies did not anticipate that God Himself would take one this role to save all peoples, not just the Jews, from the wiles and evils of the world.

A great ongoing mystery about the Incarnation is about how God chose to enter into our historical dimension. He came into the world via a relatively small, and unnoticed people in a from backwater province in the Middle East. A Jewish child from the hill country of Galilee will be the instrument of God's message of Good News and salvation. Only our all-powerful God would dare to make Himself so vulnerable in what will prove to be an openly hostile environment to His message. To an extent that environment has not changed much since those days over two thousand years ago, except the antagonists are no longer Romans and Pharisees but

In our efforts to give honor to God and to enhance the experience of the Incarnation we sometimes adopt the questionable standards of the world. We labor to ensure that everything about the season is cute, colorful, and brightly lit. The trees go up on the day after Thanksgiving and come down the day after Christmas Day. Our radios and electronic devices are blaring out songs detailing the antics of Santa Claus with our mothers under the mistletoe, or Mariah Carey is assaulting our eardrums with her desire for a boyfriend for the holiday. Our celebration of Christmas, while pleasing to the eye, has become relatively antiseptic. Outside of our churches there is almost no mention of the reason for our gaiety for fear that someone, somewhere might be offended. We are having a birthday party but we have not invited the guest of honor—outwardly in our décor or inwardly in our hearts. Why? Why go through all of the expense and headaches to celebrate something that many are choosing to ignore in that same celebration? Very simply it is because we fear change and that is what is demanded of us by God, simple and unadorned change. This is what struck fear into the persecutors of Jesus' time, and it is something that troubles us today.

What we should remember is that Christmas is actually quite simple in its origins. God chose to empty Himself and become one of us. He came into human existence in a humble and wholly natural manner. He did not avoid our pains and discomforts throughout His life and ministry. Jesus took on flesh to do the will of the Father for our benefit. Like Him, we also are of the flesh and are called to the will of the Father for our benefit, our eternal salvation. This requires changes in life and attitude, major or minor depending on the person, but there must be change and that is undesirable for many of us. We want to have the party but do not want to know or acknowledge why we are celebrating—hence the real reason for sanitizing the season. We can try to have our cake and eat it too, but the cake is so much tastier is we know why it is there in the first place. If we greet and embrace the "birthday boy" who showers <u>us</u> freely with gifts. Health, hope, happiness, and the promise of eternal life in His Kingdom forever safe from the false promises of the world and from the dangers of our own selfishness. Only in Christ do we see that can have our cake and eat it too. Reason enough to celebrate, indeed.

# An Invitation to Desire: Blessed Are Those Who Hunger for Holiness

hy was the angel sent from God to the virgin whose name was Mary? Why precisely to this girl among all the young women of Israel?

What "Sister said" to many of us in grade school (and what "Sister said" was the closest thing to working infallibility in the Catholic Church then, before or since!) was that God took flesh in Mary in answer to her desires.

Every girl in Israel, Sister said, dreamed of being the mother of the Messiah. But Mary wanted it most—most deeply, most passionately, with all her heart. So, God chose her (having chosen her from the beginning, knowing how she would respond) and fulfilled her aching desire.

And so he set the pattern for us all: What brings God to earth, what brings him to birth in a heart, is desire. Blessed are those who desire, for they shall be fulfilled.

Not every desire is fulfilled, because not every desire is for fulfillment. Not every desire is for that which can fill us "to the full." That is why God does not satisfy every desire or answer every prayer. God sent Jesus that we might "have life and have it to the full" (John 10:10). If

we do not want life to the full, our desires lack power with God. God loves too passionately to be seduced by moderate desire.

Mary the virgin is the model of human desire. Her whole being opened itself to love without limits; her whole soul to surrender without reserve. That is why her being above all others proclaimed the greatness of the Lord and her soul exulted in his fulfillment of her. In the measure that she desired it was given to her: full measure, pressed down, overflowing, overwhelming, everlasting. She confronted love with longing, power with vulnerability, fullness with emptiness, possessiveness

with surrender, domination with abandonment, divinity with her humanity. If there was a contest, she won.

Because her desire was for more than this world can give, it was fulfilled by more than this world can accomplish: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore, the

child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God." "Blessed are you among women. Blessed the fruit of your womb!"

This is the formula that brings salvation to the whole world—in all of its parts, in all of its nations, cultures, projects, undertakings and

activities. The formula that saves the world is passionate desire for that which fulfills all desire. The formula that destroys the world—in all of its parts, in all of its nations, cultures, projects, undertakings and activities—is desire that settles for less.

Behind every sin, behind every destructive thought, word or action, is infinite desire despairing of fulfillment. Desire that is focused on pleasure is desire despairing of joy. Desire that is focused on money is desire despairing of happiness. Desire that is focused on power or prestige is desire despairing of love. All desires that are focused on this world or on anything in it are desires despair-

What brings God to earth is desire

ing of God. Any desire that narrows itself down to anything less than God is nothing but a masked despair of fulfillment. There is only one desire that has no trace of despair: "I know I am the servant of the Lord: let all be done to me according to his word!"

Fear is the mirror image of desire. What does the world, what do you, fear most at this moment? Is it loss of health or employment? Of relationship, of friends? Or the loss of fidelity to God? Is it the loss of something you desire? Or the loss of desire itself? "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled."

# REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

#### **Fourth Week of Advent**

**Pray daily:** Lord, my God, my being proclaims your infinite desire. My existence comes from your infinite desire to give yourself to me without limits. Let me feel the echo of this desire in my heart and love you without restraint.

Monday: Matthew 1:1-17. "So, all the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations; and from David to the deportation to Babylon, fourteen generations; and from the deportation to Babylon to the Messiah, fourteen generations." Behind the world's history of initiatives, triumphs and defeats is the desire for fulfillment. Wisdom is the gift of appreciating what gives true fulfillment on earth. Do you long to learn from Jesus as the wisdom of God made flesh??

**Tuesday:** Matthew 1:18-24. "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife." Is your longing for a God who will intervene in your life, who will lead you and use you for his work, enough to overcome the awe and fear you feel at becoming involved with him?

Wednesday: Luke 1:5-25. The angel Gabriel said to Zechariah, "I have been sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news. But now, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time, you will become mute, unable to speak, until the day these things occur." Do you long to nurture the seed of God's word through reflection and prayer so that you might

grow to knowledge and understanding and be able to speak his truth?

Thursday: Luke 1:26-38. "[Y]ou will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David." Do you long for a human race delivered from all that divides it into hostile fragments? How much do you desire all races and cultures to be united as a single family in Christ?

**Friday:** Luke 1:39-45. "For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy." Do you believe God's light and life dawned anew in you at your Baptism? Do you long to bring to others the saving presence of his truth, his love in you?

**Saturday:** Luke 1:46-56. "He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones and lifted up the lowly." Do you believe that Jesus is overcoming the powerful of this world who put their personal good and the good of their particular countries over the good of the whole human race? Do you want to help him do this?

### LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

**As Christian:** Put in a visible place something that reminds you of the Great Commandment: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart..." (Matthew 22:37). It might be just the word "all."

As Disciple: Each time you see or hear something designed to arouse desire in you (advertisements or commercials, for example), ask yourself how real, how total is fulfillment which the satisfaction of this desire can give.

**As Prophet:** This week, as a gesture (which needs be recognized only by yourself), give up something you have come to take for granted as necessary in your life.

**As Priest:** Each day this week make an act of deep adoration of God. You might kneel and kiss the floor each morning when you wake.

**As King:** Make a list of the priorities where you work, or in your family. What is the highest? Where is God?


