# Baptism Commits Us to Drophetic Witness

hy did Jesus say the Father was "glorified" in him and that he himself, through his death and resurrection, would be "glorified?"

In the early Old Testament, the "glory of God" just meant his beauty and power. Later in the Bible it came to mean God's beauty and power made manifest on earth. In the New Testament God's beauty and power are made manifest in Jesus Christ, but in an unexpected way. In Jesus the power of God shows itself as a deliberate renunciation of power on this earth. In Jesus the beauty of God was revealed on the cross when, humanly speaking, there was nothing that would attract us to him (see Isaiah 53:2).

Jesus on the cross was weakness and foolishness to human eyes, but in reality, he was the "power of God and the wisdom of God" revealed as never before (see 1 Corinthians 1:18-25). He was the glory of God. Jesus glorified the Father by showing what the Father really is. And now it is our mission to glorify Jesus by showing what he really was and is. Jesus prayed for his disciples at the Last Supper, saying, "It is in them that I have been glorified" (John 17:10). And Jesus is glorified in us today whenever our lives reveal the power of his grace, the truth of his identity as Savior of the world, the reality of his victory on the cross over sin and death. In other words, Jesus is glorified in us whenever our lives bear witness to the presence of his Spirit in us and to the power of his grace.

We glorify Jesus, whom the world last saw defeated and dead on the cross, when our lives make it evident that we are indeed the risen Body of Jesus still present and ministering on earth.

This is a mission to which we were consecrated and committed by Baptism. By Baptism we were incorporated into Christ; we became members of his body, the body that hung and died on the cross, the body that rose again. Saint Paul teaches that through Baptism we died in Christ and rose again in Christ to live a new life, a life on his own divine level (see Romans 6:3-1 l; Colossians 2:12; 3:1-11). And so, we are the Body of Christ on earth. We are his continuing, risen presence. We exist in this

world as sent; we are sent as Jesus was sent: to be the visible manifestation of God's divine life present and acting in human flesh. By Baptism we were commissioned to be the glory of the risen Christ!

This is a consecration to Christian witness. And Christian witness, to be effective, must be prophetic. This means that what we do must express a level of insight and ideals beyond what is commonly taken for granted in our society—even beyond what is commonly and correctly identified as Christianity. Effective witness to Jesus Christ and to his Spirit dwelling within us begins when our behavior goes beyond what is commonly expected of good human beings or even of good Christians.

The reason for this is fairly simple: if all we do is live up to what is commonly expected of Christians, there is no way for anyone to know whether we are just conforming to our religious culture out of inertia or whether we ourselves are in live, personal contact with Jesus and with his Spirit. If, on the other hand, we are "prophetic" in our behavior; that is, if we find new and creative ways to apply the teaching of Jesus to the actual circumstances of our own times, then it will be evident that Christ's words are abiding in our hearts, are part of us, and that his Spirit is guiding our response to them. We are "prophets," not when we just repeat what everybody says and accept what everybody sees (although much of our religion will obviously be this), but when we also see things nobody else has seen yet and apply the Gospel to life by doing things nobody else has ever thought to do. When we do this, we glorify Jesus by showing that his



defeat was in fact a victory, and that he has indeed redeemed the world.

We bear witness to Jesus when our lives bear witness to his divine life working within us; that is, when our behavior is on the level of God.

# REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

#### Fifth Week of Easter

**Pray daily:** Lord, fill me with desire to glorify you, to make your truth credible and your grace visible in everything I do. I want to promise you a life of continual conversion. Give me the love to keep changing things in my lifestyle in order to bear more authentic witness to you. Amen.

Monday: John 14: 21-26: Jesus said, "The Advocate, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." What in your behavior shows that you are acting in a way that at least tries to be a response to inspirations of the Holy Spirit?

**Tuesday:** John 14:27-31: Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." What in your life shows that your peace, your security, are not based on money, position, power, or anything else this world can give?

Wednesday: John 15:1-8: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and everyone that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit." How has God "pruned" you most recently? What is the last thing you have changed in your lifestyle in order that you might bear fruit more effectively for God?

**Thursday:** John 15:9-11: "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete." What words of Jesus have you read recently that have increased your joy? Did the joy come from responding to them? In action? Is there a visible and growing joy in your life that bears witness to your awareness of loving him and being loved by him?

**Friday:** John 15:12-17: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." How are you loving others precisely as Jesus has loved you? What is different between the kind of love you give and the kind of love for people that any decent person respects and admires?

**Saturday:** John 15:18-21: Jesus said, "If you belonged to the world, the world would love its own; but because you do not belong to the world, and I have chosen you out of the world, the world hates you." What in your way of living or acting arouses hostility in people, not because it is bad, but because it is based on the values of Jesus? If everybody accepts you, is that something to worry about?

# LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: Kneel before Jesus and consciously commit yourself to living a life of prophetic witness. In practical terms, promise to keep making changes in your lifestyle guided by the goal of making everything you own, use, do or say bear witness to the values of Christ.

As Disciple: As you read Scripture, look for the teachings or sayings of Jesus that are so different from what "everybody" does that it is hard to take them seriously. Ask how you could take them seriously.

As Prophet: Each day this week find one thing in your environment or behavior that you can change precisely to make it bear better witness to the values of Jesus. What do people see and hear when they are around you? What values are you expressing to them?

As Priest: Each day this week, think of yourself as commissioned by God to nurture those you live and work with. See how many ways you can do this.

As King: Ask yourself—or others you know well—what the "mission" of your business is in terms of serving people or making the world a better place in which to live. Ask what needs to be changed in order to fulfill this mission more effectively. (If you are not working, ask the same question about your parish or your family life. Offer to help.)
