



Baptism Makes Us Family

hrough Baptism, Saint Paul tells us, we are "strangers and aliens no longer," but "fellow citizens of the saints and members of the household of God" (Ephesians 2:19). God has "rescued us from the power of darkness." He did it by "bringing us into the kingdom of his beloved Son" (Colossians 1:13). The sign that we have been redeemed, that we are saved, is that "there does not exist among [us] Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female. All are one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:28).

Baptism is not just a washing. It is above all an incorporation. The blood of Christ only washes away the sins of his own Body—and by Baptism we became the Body of Christ. We were baptized "into" the body that hung on the cross. We are saved by our union with him in one Body. It is only because we are one with Christ that, when he died, we died in him. It is only because we are his Body that when he rose, we rose in him free of sin.

Today's Gospel calls us to give external expression to the mystery of unity that is ours with Christ and with all who are "in Christ," who are members of his Body by Baptism. The fundamental commandment for those who are united to him, Jesus tells us, is love: to love God above all things; to love our neighbor as ourselves. Love is

a sign of our Baptism, and love is a sign of grace, because love is a sign of unity. If we are one in Christ, we don't categorize each other as being "one of us" ("Jew") or "one of them" ("Greek"—or, in today's Gospel, "Samaritan"). We don't take either a chauvinistic or a militant stance toward each other as male or female. We don't relate to people as rich or poor ("slave or free"). In the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus shows us that Baptism abolishes all these divisions. Now we are simply one people: "a chosen race, a royal priesthood,


a holy nation, a people he claims for his own to proclaim the glorious works' of the One who called [us] from darkness into his marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). Our "neighbor" is anyone who is, or who is called to be, a child of God. We have no more "neighbors" and "non-neighbors." We only have brothers and sisters in Christ, actual or potential. This is what Baptism brings about.

Baptism calls us to many virtues. Saint Paul lists "heartfelt mercy," kindness, humility, meekness, patience and forgiveness. But over all of these, he says, "put on love, which binds the rest together and makes them perfect." The fruit of this is peace. "Christ's peace must reign in your hearts, since as members of the one body you have been called to that

peace" (Colossians 3:12-15).

We cannot love our neighbors as ourselves unless we know who we are. Before we can know what to cherish and respect in our neighbor, we have to be aware of what we should cherish and respect in ourselves. And we cannot value ourselves or anyone else as we should unless we are aware that we are the sacred Body of Christ, sanctified temples of the Holy Spirit, sharers in the life of God by grace, called to live forever in absolute beauty and lovableness in heaven.

We cannot love our neighbors as ourselves unless we know who we are.



This is true of us, and this is true of every other person who has been baptized into Jesus Christ. To love our neighbors as ourselves is to be conscious that our neighbors are all of these things and relate to them accordingly.

Our neighbors don't always behave like enlightened, loving embodiments of Jesus Christ. But then, neither do we. We know from experience that it is possible to be redeemed and surrendered to Christ's ideals of love and goodness while still failing in many ways. That is why we need to forgive each other constantly. To do this it helps to remember that we are all one Body in Christ.

REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

Fifteenth Week of the Year

Pray daily: Lord, so that we all might be in communion with God and with each other you became one of us. You took on our human condition. Teach me to identify with every human being on that level where you have already made us one by creation and by grace. And teach me to grow from there into conscious communion with every person I meet. Amen.

Monday: Matthew 10:34 to 11:1: Jesus said, "Do not think that I have come to bring peace upon the earth. I have come to bring not peace but the sword. For I have come to set a man 'against his father, a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law." Has anyone rejected you because of the ideals you have accepted as a Christian? Because of the people you accept? If so, does this make you divisive?

Tuesday: Matthew 11:20-24: "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty deeds done in your midst had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would long ago have repented in sackcloth and ashes." If you reject the call to be one with all the family of God, where does that leave you?

Wednesday: Matthew 11:25-27: "No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father

except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him." Do you know Jesus? Do you know the Father? Do you experience deep communion of heart with all who do?

Thursday: Matthew 11:28-30: Jesus said, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Is his voice saying this to others in you? Does your behavior toward others invite them to find comfort in you?

Friday: Matthew 12:1-8: Jesus said, "If you had known what this means, 'I desire mercy and not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the guiltless." If you truly understand the heart of Christ, will you condemn people for doing what is right? Do you now? Do you stand by while others do?

Saturday: Matthew 12:14-21: Isaiah said of the Messiah, "He will not wrangle or cry aloud, nor will anyone hear his voice in the streets." Would Jesus shout slogans at people who are doing wrong? How would he try to convert them? What is your approach to people in error?

LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: Sit down and face very seriously your attitude toward the rest of the human race. How has your Baptism affected it? Do you see every child of God as your brother or sister? How do you show it?

As Disciple: Read Paul's letter to the Colossians, chapter 1, verses 9 to 23.

As Prophet: Ask yourself what signs of acceptance or of fellowship you give to the people you identify with but not to others. See what happens if you make the same gesture to someone else.

As Priest: List in order of priority the people you are committed to taking care of. What seems to determine the priorities?

As King: Do the same thing with the work you take responsibility for. What goals are you most committed to accomplishing and why?
