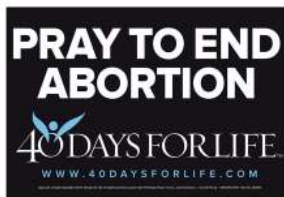
This facility provides the abortion pill and refers for abortions. Dozens of area churches have adopted a day of prayer.

Shades of Light and Dark

Matthew uses Isaiah to present Jesus as a “great light” shining on those who before had “walked in darkness” in a “land of gloom.” Jesus is good news because he shows us how to avoid the errors of a culture which diminishes the quality of life for us, makes life destructive. Jesus came that we might “have life, and have it abundantly” (John 10:10). His light, his teachings guide us to it.

If we truly understood and believed everything Jesus taught and lived by it, then we would have the fullest, happiest lives possible on this earth. This does not, however, mean lives without suffering. That is hardly possible in the world we know. For Christians sent to offer themselves as “living sacrifices” for the life of the world, that is not even desirable. A football player can escape pain by sitting on the bench, but then he is not in the game. Jesus says a woman has pain giving birth but forgets it, in the joy of giving new life. Saint Paul wrote that the message of the cross which he preached is foolishness to those without faith, but to believers it is the way to the fullness of life, even on this earth (see 1 Corinthians 1:18-24).

Do we really believe and understand what Jesus taught? Christians, even in the same Church, are not always united in what they believe. Saint Paul urged the Corinthians to be in agreement in the name of Jesus and allow no division among them, to be united in one mind and purpose.

Catholics have the advantage of belonging to a Church which can teach with authority as Jesus did (see Matthew 7:29; 2 Corinthians 10:8). But since infallible teaching is rare, on most

practical issues Catholics are just as free to disagree with each other as Protestants are—and we do! Yet insofar as we fail to understand and live by what Jesus teaches, we will walk in darkness and in the gloom of death. So where do we look for light?

First, we believe everything in Scripture; most of it is so clear that Church leaders have not needed to interpret it officially. Second, we also believe with absolute faith whatever the Church has defined as dogma in Church councils since the earliest days. And third, unless we have very serious reasons to disagree, we believe whatever is officially and commonly taught throughout the whole Church. Finally, when it comes to ordinary letters (encyclicals) and teachings of popes and bishops, we try respectfully to understand and accept what they say whenever possible. But we can disagree on the last

two levels without denying our faith. This is always risky, but we need to know it is our right.

Freedom to disagree does not free a person from

the consequences. If we do not walk in the light of Christ, we will walk in darkness. This always puts us in the “gloom of death” by destroying our life to some degree. To live life abundantly, we want and need to know what Christ teaches.

REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

Third Week of the Year

***Pray daily:** Jesus, you came to be the Word of God made flesh and the law of God made flesh. I believe that in your words and in your example, I can find the law of love to live by. Give me fullness of life through the fullness of your light. Amen.*

Monday: Mark 3:22-30. “If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand.” Do you pursue Christ’s goals in some areas of your life and then selfish goals in other areas? Do you want your every decision to be guided by Christ’s teachings?

Tuesday: Mark 3:31-35. “Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother.” By “will of God,” does Jesus mean just keeping the Ten Commandments? What would identify you to others as belonging to Jesus’ family?

Wednesday: Mark 4:1-20. “Other seed fell into good soil and brought forth grain, growing up and increasing and yielding thirty and sixty and a hundredfold.” How is God’s word visibly bearing fruit in your life? Can you identify the ways? What can you do to make yourself “good soil” to receive the words of Jesus?

Thursday: Mark 4:21-25. “For to those who have, more will be given; and from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away.” We have all

been taught the same faith. In what ways do you foster its growth or hinder it?

Friday: Mark 4:26-34. “The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed, which...grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches...” Must the entire doctrine, behavior, and liturgy of Christians be today exactly what it was in the time of the apostles? How have you seen the whole Church grow in understanding and response to the Gospel?

Saturday: Mark 4:35-41. The apostles were filled with great awe and said to one another, “Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?” Do you try to know and obey all the teachings of Jesus with this kind of awe and wonder?

LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: For a week, take the Bible and some other book or magazine you read often. Put them side by side on a table and ask yourself daily, “Which of these do I really follow as my ‘bible’?”

As Disciple: For a week, in everything you read, underline any value or attitude that seems contrary to the ideals and attitudes taught by Jesus.

As Prophet: At least once this week, at home, at work or in your social life, raise the question with someone else whether some attitude or practice that seems commonly accepted truly reflects Jesus’ teaching.

As Priest: Try to bring someone a little more out of “darkness and the gloom of death” through words of encouragement, advice or invitation.

As King: Look at something that is not as it should be, at home, at work or in your social life, and use the light of Christ’s teachings to see how you should change it.
