"That Everyone Who Believes ..."

God sent his Son, not "that we might have life," but "so that everyone who believes" might have eternal life. Even while rescuing us, God respects us. In the act of redeeming human nature wounded by sin, he uses the human nature he created. Jesus came "that everyone who believes" "might not die but might have eternal life."

John wrote, "And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (John 17:3). Eternal life is knowing and believing in the God whom Jesus preached: the God who revealed himself to Moses as "merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness" (Exodus 34:6).

When John wrote the Good News of Jesus Christ, he picked up these two theme words which appear together repeatedly in the Hebrew Scriptures: *hesed*, which we translate as "steadfast love," "kindness" or "grace"; and *emet*, which we translate as "faithfulness," "fidelity" or "truth." The 1970 edition of the New American Bible translated them together as "enduring love" (see John 1:17). Eternal life, according to John, is to know God as the God of "enduring love." Jesus came that "everyone who believes" in this God of kindness and faithfulness, this God of enduring love, might have eternal life. The key is: "everyone who believes."

God did not "send the Son into the world to condemn the world." This doesn't mean that Jesus does not denounce sin. There would be no greater condemnation of the world than for God to write off human nature as hopeless and therefore accept any human behavior as the best that can be expected from poor, miserable creatures like us. On the contrary, Jesus revealed God as a God of mercy and compassion so that we might extend mercy and compassion to one another. Jesus showed us God's love lifted up to the height of self-giving on the cross; Jesus commanded us to "love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12). He came "that everyone who believes" may have eternal life in love.

TRINITY SUNDAY

Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9;
2 Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18

To love as Jesus loves is hard for us because we think everything about us is so important. And, in truth, we are more important than we can even dream of, but no particular thing about us is important enough to fight over. Jesus showed us God's love carried to the depths of humility when he "did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave" (Philippians 2:6). Jesus accepted the reality of human nature. He took flesh, and was born in nakedness and poverty, in human vulnerability, to unite us with himself. And everyone who believes must do the same.

Jesus came down to us, he met us where we were—in our woundedness, in our need. He did not let our rejection of him or our sins against him keep him from coming to us, from offering us the hand of friendship. But he requires us to believe—to recognize, to decide, to accept the love he offers us—and to offer it to one another. "This is eternal life": to know God's self-abasing love revealed in Jesus Christ and to believe that in his emptying of himself for us and in our emptying of ourselves for one another, we come to life in its fullness.

Truth revealed took flesh in Jesus Christ. Truth received must take flesh in all those who believe. "Everyone who believes" is commissioned to bear prophetic witness to the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ by embodying in human words and actions the divine life of God's Son, the life present in his Body on earth. "Everyone who believes" is consecrated a priest to mediate the



love of God to others, to take on the priestly office of expressing constantly the life-giving, nurturing love of the Father, to be the channel through which the Father continues to give life to the world.

Finally, “everyone who believes” is sent as a steward of Christ’s kingship to bring everything in heaven and on earth together into unity in the “fellowship of the Holy Spirit”—so that “they all may be one... so that the world may believe” and “everyone who believes may have eternal life.”

REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

Ninth Week of the Year

***Pray daily:** Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles, “Peace I leave to you, my peace I give to you. “Look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and grant us the peace and unity of your kingdom, where you live for ever and ever. Amen.*

Monday: Mark 12:1-12. “Have you not read this scripture: “The stone that the builders rejected/ has become the cornerstone...?” Have you rejected Jesus as a teacher of peace? With whom are you willing to fight? Over what? Did Jesus teach this?

Tuesday: Mark 12:13-17. Jesus said, “Give to the emperor the things that are the emperor’s, and to God the things that are God’s.” Which of your other loyalties may cause conflict with your loyalty to God? Do you ever hurt some people out of loyalty to others?

Wednesday: Mark 12:18-27. Jesus said to the Sadducees, “Is not this the reason you are wrong, that you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God?” Can you think of any mistakes you made in the past because you did not keep God’s power in mind? Because you failed to think about what is in Scripture? Could anything in your attitudes or decisions today be distorted for the same reason?

Thursday: Mark 12:28-34. When asked what is the first commandment, Jesus replied: “The first is, ‘Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God...is one; you shall love the

Lord your God with all your heart,...soul,...mind, and... strength.’ The second is this, ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’” How can you build peace in yourself and among those around you by keeping these commandments?

Friday: Mark 12:35-37. Jesus said, “David himself calls [the Messiah] Lord; so how can he be [David’s] son?” How do you think of Jesus? What is he for you?

Saturday: Mark 12:38-44. “Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had.” Do you ever hold back from offering your service or help because what you have to offer seems insignificant?

LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: Whenever anything disturbs your peace, stop for a moment and remember that Jesus dwells in your heart as helper, guide and friend. Fear is the enemy of peace. Trusting in God is the foundation of peace.

As Disciple: Read Scripture every day this week, asking specifically how Jesus’ teaching can establish peace and unity in your home, at work, in your city and in the world.

As Prophet: Reconsider whether anything you do or your group does expresses an attitude of division from other people. Decide what you can do to express unity.

As Priest: Identify five people who are hurting in some way. Do one thing this week just to show love to each of them.

As King: Divide a piece of paper into two columns. Write “Us” at the top of one column and “Them” at the top of the other. List the people or groups you think of as “us” and “them.” Think of one thing you can do to help yourself and those you think of as “us” to begin to think of “them” as “us,” too.

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
