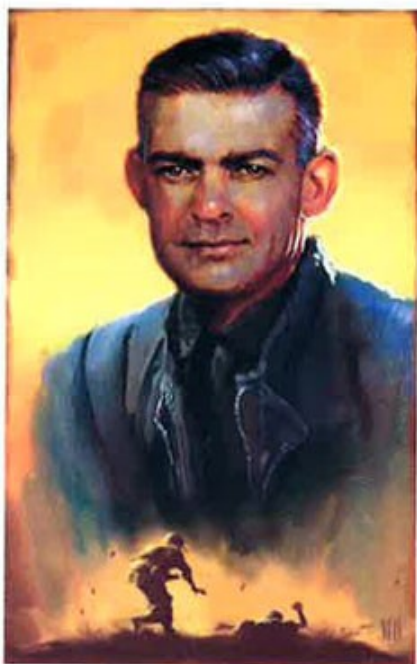

UNCLE AL'S THRIFT SHOP

Uncle Al's window display is always current, well done and interesting. But we want to draw your attention to the current display which is very special. With at Memorial Day theme, each item in the window has meaning. Please be sure to stop by and look at it. Our thanks to all in the community who so graciously loaned the uniforms and other precious keepsakes.

There is a small round table in the display that is set in a certain, special way. The explanation posted in front of the table reads like this:

MISSING MAN TABLE

The TABLE is round to show our concern for our mission men and the loneliness we feel.

The TABLECLOTH is white symbolizing the purity of their motives when answering the call to serve.

The single ROSE reminds us of the lives of these Americans and their families who keep their faith while awaiting their return.

The RED RIBBON symbolizes our continued determination to account for the missing.

A SLICE OF LEMON reminds us of their bitter fate.

The SALT symbolizes the tears of our missing and their families and loved ones.

The GLASS is inverted... symbolizing their inability to share a toast.

The CHAIR is empty; they cannot sit with us tonight.

We honor each of them, all of them.

The Feast of Corpus Christi and the Forty Hours Devotion

This devotion has a long tradition in our Church. It calls to mind the hours Our Divine Lord spent in the tomb before His Resurrection. It also reminds us that during this time, He descended into the region of the dead to call forth the souls of the faithful to share in His triumph over sin and death. In observance of this profound truth, we enter into prayer at the time of the Church's celebration of Corpus Christi. For as Our Lord Himself said: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day."

For a number of years now, our Parish has held the Forty Hours Devotion beginning on the Feast of Corpus Christi. We will have our Eucharistic Procession following the 12 Noon Mass on **June 19th**. We will process through the village and have a Benediction on returning to the Church. At that moment the Forty Hours will begin. The Holy Eucharist will be exposed on our Altar in Church, continuously until Tuesday morning at 7am. It is extremely important that Our Lord always have someone with Him in adoration. We invite all of our parishioners to sign up for an hour of adoration. The sign-up sheet will be in the back of the Church for **June 19-21**. We encourage families to come together for a time of adoration. Also, we especially encourage that more than one person be present in the Church building during the night hours. This is a time of great sacrifice, grace and blessing for our Parish and families. Come and be with the Lord; He will not be outdone in generosity.
