They have done good work helping to get the Fund off of the ground and distributing the grants over the last few years. The new members of the Deacon George Social Justice Fund Board are: Tim Callery who will serve as a representative of the Parish Finance Council, Kathy Schwartz who will serve as a representative of the Parish Pastoral Council, and Angie Schmidbauer and Tom Paniwozik who will serve in at large positions having been appointed by me. If you have any questions or suggestions with regard to the Deacon George Social Justice Fund please feel free to contact one of these four or me. Also remember that by having the parish tithe of 5% we are constantly reminding ourselves of the necessity of the works of charity -that out of every dollar donated in the collection at Mass 5% of that is going to benefit not ourselves in our selfishness but is going to help the poor somewhere in our community or nation or world. Charity is not something that is an option for us but rather if we truly want to be sincere followers of Jesus than charity is a necessity in our lives. The parish tithe and the Deacon George Social Justice Fund is our constant reminder of that. So thank you for your support of the Parish and thereby your charity to the poor.
